After all, someday you may be the mom who is helping a girl learn to do the very same thing!

Go!

Therefore go, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. { Matthew 28:19 }

veryone is invited to "go" make disciples. God wants us to accept His invitation to this amazing adventure of sharing our faith. When we do, we get to *disciple* people. That means we help them first understand what it means to believe in Jesus, and then we teach them to grow in their faith.

Many of us think everyone has heard about Him. Sadly, that's not true. About 3 billion people in the world don't know that He loves them and died for them. That's why it's important that we "go."

Sometimes God's Spirit plants a desire in our hearts to "go." Years ago, I sensed God was going to invite me to be His missionary in Africa! I started praying, and then I got an email from a man I had never met asking me to help him share God's love in Zambia's public schools. Within one year, I was on an airplane for one of the greatest adventures of my life.

God probably won't call you to "go" to Zambia, but maybe He'll ask you to "go" across the street and share the love of Jesus with your neighbor. I hope you will say "yes" to the adventure!

ACTION POINT: If you can, find a globe or a world map. Select a special country to pray for this month as we talk about the command to "go" into the world and share Jesus' love.

Language Lab: What Does "Great Commission" Mean?

Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age. { Matthew 28:20 }



hen I was younger, my mom often handed me a big, round, light blue glass bowl. Then she would say, "Go pick some of Grandma's strawberries for me so that I can make strawberry shortcake." Oh, I loved that job. I loved going to Grandma Barker's strawberry patch for my mom. Basically, when she assigned me to pick strawberries, she was giving me a *commission*. A commission is something we're told to do. And something we're supposed to obey.

After Jesus was crucified and rose from the dead, He saw His disciples one last time on Earth and gave them the **Great Commission**. We read about it in Matthew 28:18–20. He told them to go everywhere they could and teach people about Him. And He promised that He would go with them! Isn't that a comfort!?

When you hear about the Great Commission, remember that it's your commission, too. Remember to be obedient when He invites you to go on an adventure to share His Truth!

ACTION POINT: Get a piece of paper and write the names of three people who do not know Jesus. Post it somewhere so you can remember to pray for them this month as you do your part to obey the Great Commission.

ids Matter to Jesus

o you have a little sister or brother? When I was 10 years old, I received the amazing gift of a baby sister. I held her carefully and sang to her about Jesus. My mom let me pick out her clothes and comb her hair. When I was your age, she was starting school. She would swing in our backyard in the afternoons while I listened to her talk about her day.

I didn't realize it then, but those acts of kindness like combing her hair and listening to her were important. My sister knew I loved Jesus, and my kindness helped her want to love Jesus, too.

Now, my "baby sister" is a mom! She holds her girls carefully and sings to them about Jesus. She combs their hair and talks to them while they swing. She is still my good friend, and we encourage each other to keep loving Jesus.

Here's what I learned: kids matter to God. He gives us younger siblings, neighbors, and children at church as a gift. When we care for them, we point them to Jesus. And, as today's verse says, when we show them kindness, He feels like we cared for *Him*.

ACTION POINT: Give special time and attention to a younger child. Maybe you could sing "Jesus Loves Me" or another song about Jesus. Smile! Play! Be a friend.

ave you ever visited a place where they speak a different language than you do? I have!

■ I recently went on a trip to the Dominican Republic to visit our Chica Verdadera team. It was amazing! There was only one (BIG) problem...I can't speak Spanish. Well, except for the basics like "hello" (*hola*) and goodbye (*adiós*). So, when we shared the gospel with the girls there, I realized how much I needed my translator! I couldn't get past surface-level conversations without her.

Sometimes my prayer life feels the same way. Maybe I had a really hard day, and I'm just too tired to express everything to God. Or I know something is wrong, but I just don't have the right words to say. That's when the Holy Spirit comes in to help "translate."

In Romans 8:26, Paul says that when we're weak, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us. *Intercede* is a fancy word that means "to plead for the needs of someone else." When you're praying, the Holy Spirit does that for you. He knows what you're thinking and what you need, and He expresses that to God for you. He always has your back!

ACTION POINT: Spend some extra time praying today. If you can't think of the right words, thank God for giving you the Holy Spirit to help translate.

ave you ever gone to a Christian camp? If you have, maybe you have a favorite camp counselor. I do! It's my daughter.

Send Me!

Then I heard the LORD asking, "Whom should I send as a messenger to this people? Who will go for us?" I said, "Here I am. Send me." { Isaiah 6:8 }



o you ever believe you've done too many bad things for God to use you? Sometimes I still feel guilty for stuff I've already been forgiven for. It got to a point where

I apologized when it wasn't even my fault! Then my mom shared this verse with me: "So now there is no condemnation for those who belong to Christ Jesus." (Romans 8:1)

You see that? No condemnation! Condemnation is punishment or judgment. If we belong to Jesus Christ, we are forgiven and free from sin!

You know, there's a prophet in the Old Testament who also felt like God couldn't use a guy like him. His name was Isaiah. When God called him to speak the Word of the Lord to the Israelite people, he couldn't believe it! God wanted to use *him*, a man who often sinned with his tongue, to speak the words of Truth! But God purified his lips and called him to be His prophet. Isaiah's response? *"Here I am. Send me!"*

God is calling us to go and share the love of Jesus with others too! So, don't allow guilt and shame to keep you from saying, "Here I am. Send me!"

ACTION POINT: Write down a list of stuff you still feel guilty about even though God's forgiven you. Now scribble over each one and write Romans 8:1 on the page. Tell God you're thankful that in Christ, there's no condemnation!

Stinky Fish

Jesus called out to them, "Come, follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people!" { Matthew 4:19 }

remember visiting San Francisco with my parents when I was your age. We would always go to Chinatown, which I was never too happy about. That's because I didn't like

Chinese food back then. (Now I love orange chicken, but I'm not sure how authentic that is.) The worst was the dreaded fish market. It stunk—literally!

It was a wild adventure for my senses. There were small fish, big fish, silver fish, and pink fish all piled high. My poor nose! I couldn't wait to leave, but I suppose Jesus would have felt right at home there. He was used to hanging out with fishermen, which means He was very comfortable with smelly fish. In Matthew 4:19, Jesus told His disciples that He would teach them how to fish. But for people, not fish!

Fishing takes patience. The fish don't just jump into your boat or nets. When you fish for people, it also takes time. Sometimes the experience might even stink. But keep loving your friends and telling them stories about what God has done in your life. That's the kind of fishing you can do anywhere!

ACTION POINT: Who is someone you can invite to church? Talk to your mom and ask if you could pick this girl up for church sometime and pray that your friend will say yes.

How Will They Know?

But how can they call on Him to save them unless they believe in Him? And how can they believe in Him if they have never heard about Him? And how can they hear about Him unless someone tells them? { Romans 10:14 }

ave you ever felt a divine nudge? It's that unusual feeling you have when the Holy Spirit is gently encouraging you to do or say something. A nudge never goes against what God's Word says. But it may be out of your comfort zone.

Once I had a divine nudge to share God's love with a woman standing outside a gas station. However, another thought came to my mind. My logical self convinced me that this woman would not listen to me if I told her about Jesus. Plus, it's not really safe to go up to strangers at gas stations and start talking to them, right? (At your age, you definitely shouldn't do that without asking your parents first.) As I drove away, I realized that I had ignored a divine nudge. That lady needed to hear God loved her, and I had said, "No!" How would she ever believe in Jesus if no one told her about Him?

God wants to use us to tell others about His great love. I will never know what might have happened if I had talked to that woman. The next time I will ask God for the courage to follow His still, small voice.

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom if she's ever felt a divine nudge and how she responded. Pray together and ask God to help you know when He's nudging you to tell others about His amazing love.

The Little Man of the Eye

ook closely at yourself in the mirror. Get one to two inches away from your reflection until you can see thattiny picture of yourself in your pupil. Can you spot it?

When today's verse says "His own eyes," it is talking about that tiny picture. Your Bible version might have the words "the pupil of his eye" or "the apple of his eye" instead. But in Hebrew, the language the Bible was first written in, the word that's used means "the little man of the eye." Moses was reminding the Israelites that God was keeping them close to Himself. So close that if they'd been able to see Him face-to-face, they could have spotted themselves in His eyes.

Remember how close you have to be to see yourself in someone else's eyes? Really super close.

When Jesus promised He would be with you always, I bet you didn't realize He meant this close. But He did! You are that close to God all the time. If it were possible, you would be able to see your reflection in His eyes.

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom or BFF if you can get close enough so she can see herself in your eyes. Let her know this is how close she is to God. He protects her like "the little man of the eye."

 Twice! That's what happened to Samuel. a young boy

who grew into a mighty man of God. Well, what if I told you that you can sense God speaking to you?

I have a special memory from Vacation Bible School when I was finally old enough to be an assistant teacher instead of just a helper. While I was teaching the preschoolers how to be fishers of men, God spoke to me. He didn't talk out loud as He did to Samuel. There wasn't a voice that I could hear. Instead, I *sensed* what God was telling me. I knew it was Him. Do you want to know what He said? "Amber, I want you to do this for the rest of your life." He was inviting me to keep teaching kids about Him.

God can speak to us in many ways. He gave us the Bible as His message to us, and He talks to us through it. But, if we are listening, He also communicates to us through prayer. And, that day at VBS, I'm so glad I heard His invitation to "go"!

ACTION POINT: It's hard to hear God if you aren't taking the time to listen. So spend some time in prayer today. But instead of talking to God, try being quiet and letting Him speak to you.

Don't forget to show hospitality to strangers, for some who have done this have entertained angels without realizing it! { Hebrews 13:2 }

Staught me about "stranger danger," which helped keep me safe! Is this verse in Hebrews chapter thirteen *really* telling us that it's good to invite strangers home with us?

When Jesus sent out His disciples, He had them go out two by two. That's like when your mom tells you and a friend or sibling to stick together at the park. Jesus knew the importance of being on a mission in a team! We are stronger, braver, and wiser together! That's one reason God put you in a family. Together, you can pray about helping and welcoming strangers *together*. (Never do this alone!)

ACTION POINT: Is there someone who does not know Jesus, who you could invite for a meal? Talk to your mom about reaching out to this stranger together. Then, pray together and wait for them to show up on your doorstep!



Have You Been Baptized?

es, you read about this verse earlier this month! I wanted to come back to it and ask you an important question: **have you been baptized?**

Baptism is a picture of God's rescue plan. It's an act that helps us to remember what Jesus did for us on the cross. When we go under water, that symbolizes how Jesus died for us. When we come up, that illustrates how Jesus rose from the grave. Baptism is a way for us to say, "I believe in what Jesus did and that He died for me."

Jesus was baptized. Matthew 3:13–17 tells us he asked John the Baptist to do it. God the Father was pleased! He sent a dove to land on Jesus, and a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son. I'm pleased with Him."

When I was 16, I was baptized. I was at a baptism service and realized that I'd never publicly been baptized. So, I asked if I could be, and I was! It was a special day.

I hope you've had a special day like that too, or that you'll have one in your future! Baptism is an important step in declaring our faith.

ACTION POINT: If you've been baptized, write about it in your prayer journal. If not, talk to your mom about whether or not you're ready to be.

Going on a Treasure Hunt

You search the Scriptures because you think they give you eternal life. But the Scriptures point to me! { John 5:39 }

ave you ever been on a treasure hunt? What was the most important item on your search: the map or the treasure? I'd say the map! Without it, you'd never find the treasure. The map points you to it!

In today's Bible verse, Jesus is talking to the Jewish leaders about an amazing miracle He had just performed. But the people listening were focused on the wrong things: rules. Some spoke about the miracle they had just seen. Others had their attention on the day the miracle took place and the rules about that day.

> he greatest adventure I ever experienced was when I hiked the Grand Canyon for six days with a group of friends. It took a whole day to walk a narrow, jagged

e who called you is always faithful." When I look in my mirror each day, this paraphrase of today's verse stares back at me and encourages me. Why? Because I wrote it there so I can see it each morning.

kay, I need to confess something. Are you ready? I talk to myself! A lot! When I'm doing a new task or facing difficulty in one of my usual ones, it's easy for me to

feel overwhelmed and a bit anxious. So I quietly use my words to coach AND calm myself down.

You might hear me whisper things like, "Come on, Stac. Just keep going!" or "Calm down, Stac. It'll be cool." But, I think my favorite is, "Staci! Chill out!" I constantly remind myself to stay calm, do my best, and trust the process.

The same is true in my relationship with God. When He calls me to do something scary, hard, or a bit uncomfortable, I tell myself to chill out. ohn Wayne was one of the biggest cowboy film stars of all time. Have you ever heard of him? He made 170 movies—most of them cowboy films. A lot of people just

called him The Duke – a name that came about when John was little and went absolutely everywhere with his huge dog, Duke.

He used to say, "Courage is being scared to death but saddling up anyway." I love that. If anyone in the Bible could relate to that quote, I think it would be Joshua. You see, he became the leader of Israel after Moses' death. He had some pretty big shoes...er, sandals to fill. He must've been scared of being the leader because God repeatedly told him, "Be strong and courageous!"

Guess what? One of the most valiant victories ever recorded in the Bible was led by Joshua as the Israelites fought the battle of Jericho. The walls literally fell down! Joshua was afraid, but he "saddled up anyway."

It's okay to be scared, but dig down deep inside of you to "saddle up" for God and to be strong and courageous.

ACTION POINT: Tell your mom or dad about something that makes you feel afraid. It could be speaking in front of people, leading at school, or being alone in the dark. Ask them to pray with you to "saddle up anyway."

Think About It This Way

... when I am afraid, I will put my trust in you. { Psalm 56:3 }

o you ever lay awake at night feeling afraid, worried, or anxious? You are not the only one! I'm an adult, and sometimes, my mind spins in fear. When that happens,

I have to feed my faith in God instead of feeding my anxiety.

Here's what I do: I repeat a verse from the Bible in a special way. Each time I say it, I emphasize—or put extra *oomph* on—one word. This helps me think about the verse from different angles and understand it better.

For example, I may work through Psalm 56:3. I repeat the verse like this:

When I am afraid, I will put my trust in you.
When I am afraid, I will put my trust in you.
When I am afraid, I will put my trust in you.
When I am afraid, I will put my trust in you.
And so on, until I get to the last word and say:
When I am afraid, I will put my trust in you.

Thinking about the words helps me calm down. I remember how much God loves me and that I can trust Him to protect and care for me.

ACTION POINT: Try it? Repeat Psalm 56:3 or another favorite verse by emphasizing a different word each time. Does this help you to understand the verse better? Does it help you to think about God more clearly and trust Him?

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. { Psalm 46:1 }



grew up in Houston, Texas, near the Gulf of Mexico. Every year, we braced ourselves for hurricane season. Tropical storms, heavy rains, floods, and winds strong enough to

rip trees out of the ground sometimes tore through our city, leaving a path of ruthless destruction.

Many homes in our area have "safe rooms" to provide a secure hiding place for when storms happen. These rooms offer shelter for the people who live in the house. It is a spot of refuge and strength when hurricanes are on the horizon.

Even if you don't live where there are hurricanes, you still face storms in life. We all experience trials and have fear. However, Psalm 46:1 teaches us that when we do, God is our refuge and strength. He is our safe room and helper.

>> ACTION POINT: When you feel fearful, where do you normally run for safety? Memorize Psalm 46:1. When you are afraid, speak this Truth out loud in prayer, remembering that God is your refuge.



Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine. { Isaiah 43:1 }



hen I was about 12 years old, my hometown experienced one of the biggest blackouts in history. I mean, one minute I was up in my room watching

my favorite TV show, the next I was sitting in complete darkness! Although I knew I was safe at home, a feeling of fear still came over me.

I tried to make my way down the stairs to find my parents—or a flashlight! Fear rose in me as I continued to walk into the blackness. All the parts of my house I thought I knew had become unfamiliar. I was stumbling around and losing my way.

Then, I heard a familiar voice call me. It was my mom! Hearing her call my name gave me the confidence I needed to jump down the remaining steps and run right into her arms. I ran straight to her—no tripping, no second-guessing, and NO LIGHT. I just followed her voice.

God wants you to know that even when you can't see Him and things seem dark, He is calling you. He knows your name, and you are His. So you can listen for His voice and run to Him!

ACTION POINT: Play Marco Polo in the dark with your mom. Try to pick the biggest room in the house. See how long it takes you to find one another. Then, talk about the different ways God "calls" us.

ave you ever been fearful of what God might ask you to do? Saying "yes" to God used to be the scariest thing I could imagine. I thought giving Him control meant

He would ask me to do something I hated in a place I was afraid to be. Maybe I would end up a math teacher on Mars, or a nanny in North Korea!

But that changed when I had to make a big decision. God was opening doors to an opportunity I wanted. It didn't make sense to me. What I wanted and what God wanted were supposed to be different, right?

My mentor pointed me to Psalm 37:4. The most important part of the verse comes at the beginning, not at the end. First, we have to delight in God. That means we really enjoy Him. Then, the desires of our hearts begin lining up with what He has planned for us. Those plans might be scary or challenging, but He is trustworthy.

You don't have to be afraid of following God's lead if saying "yes" is scary to you. As long as you are sticking close to Him, your desires will begin reflecting His.

ACTION POINT: Grab your journal for a little heart check! What are the things you really want right now? How do they line up with what you know God wants for you?

unxsutawney. It's pronounced "punks-a-tah-nee," and it's a town in Pennsylvania. It's home to Phil, the groundhog. Since the 1800s, it's been a tradition

Many people want to know what will happen in the future. They don't want any surprises. The Bible tells us we don't have to live that way. Proverbs 31:25 says a girl who trusts Jesus "laughs without fear of the future." I think that means she's joyful about what is happening right now, instead of worrying about what might happen later.

When we live a life of faith in God, there's no need to look for someone to tell us what's to come. The Bible tells us not to worry. Matthew 6:34 reads: "So don't worry about tomorrow ..."

Is there something you have been worried about recently? You probably won't find the answer in a groundhog, but you could find some peace if you focus with joy on today.

ACTION POINT: Is there something you've been worried about recently? You probably won't find the answer from a groundhog, but you could find some joy by writing a letter to God. Ask Him to help you "laugh without fear of the future."

The disciples were amazed. "Who is this man?" they asked. "Even the winds and waves obey Him!" { Matthew 8:27 }



week ago, some friends and I visited a beach together. We had to take a boat to get there and, at first, the ride seemed calm. But the further away we got from shore.

the harder the winds blew. The waves started to rise, and so did our fear. There were times when our boat was flying as it jumped from one wave to another.

I thought of the story in Scripture where the disciples battled a big storm in the middle of the sea. As they fought the wind and the waves, Jesus slept peacefully. They couldn't understand why He wasn't awake and helping them.

No matter what storm you face or how fearful you feel, remember that the winds and waves still know Jesus' name. So you can have faith and believe that He is with you in the boat.

Take Courage. Dear Heart

For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline. { 2 Timothy 1:7 }

id you know there are two kinds of fear? One is good and from God. The other is bad and doesn't come from Him. Good fear helps you make wise decisions. Proverbs

9:10 says, "The fear of the Lord is the foundation of wisdom." But bad fear comes from believing lies. Maybe it's the lie that God won't take care of you.

Today's verse talks about bad fear. When you hear a lie and feel afraid, this verse reminds you that what you're feeling isn't from God. Instead, He gives you His gifts of power, love, and self-discipline. These gifts lead you to take courage.

You can also be brave because God is with you. In Deuteronomy 31:6, Joshua is taking Moses' place as the people's leader. Moses tells him, "So be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid and do not panic before them. For the LORD, your God will personally go ahead of you. He will neither fail you nor abandon you." Like Joshua, you aren't alone!

So, when lies make you feel afraid, remind yourself that bad fear isn't from God. Then, take courage because the God who is with you has given you all you need!

ACTION POINT: Write down your own examples of bad fear and good fear. Then, talk about your worries with your mom. Now, find a Bible verse to help you take courage!

edtime is rough when you are scared of everything. And I was afraid a lot as a kid. So to help me not be so frightened, I would pretend that my blanket made me

invisible. That way, the (imaginary) things I was scared of wouldn't be able to see me. Instead, they'd only see my brown blanket!

But, as you've already guessed, my blanket didn't actually make me invisible. And it didn't really keep me from being afraid. But I found something that did work: the Bible. When I would lay awake at night, thinking about all of the things I was fearful of, I would talk to God and recite Bible verses. (Psalm 23 was my favorite.) I was then able to drift off to sleep, knowing that God was with me.

God was with me, and He's with you too. He surrounds us with His love. And, things don't seem so scary when we are with Him. Knowing God is there makes all the difference!

ACTION POINT: Pick a passage of Scripture and memorize it to help you when you are scared. Psalm 23 and Isaiah 41:10 are great choices. They remind us that God is with us, leading and guiding us always.

Run the Right Way

hen we're afraid, most of us tend to do one of two things. Either we feel frozen by fear, or we run away from what frightens us.

So how does God encourage us to react when we're scared? He doesn't want fear to paralyze us. But He does want us to run. Not away from something, but to something—His Name! But how do you run to a name? That sounds strange, right?

Throughout the Bible, God tells us about Himself by sharing His different names. Each one communicates to us a part of His character or who He is. Running to the names of God helps our hearts remember very important truths about God.

Here's what that might look like. The other day I felt anxious and stressed. Do you know what name of the Lord I ran to? The Omniscient. This name reminds me that God knows everything. 
The same is true for us today. You don't have to be afraid because God personally goes ahead of you. He never fails and will never leave you. Wherever you go, He will always be there to protect you!

cientists say there are three ways we respond to fear. They are fight, flight, and freeze. Fight is when our fear makes us angry, and we try to fight against it ourselves.

Flight means we run away from situations that scare us. And freeze is when we are so speechless or shocked that we can't do things we usually do.

But can I add a fourth one that works much better than the other three? Faith.

While our bodies may pick fight, flight, or freeze, our spirits can choose faith. When we do, we decide to pray and worship when we're afraid. And the Bible tells us that calling out to the Lord is the greatest weapon we have against fear.

In the book of Acts, Paul and Silas got chained up in a cold prison cell. Sounds pretty scary, right? But the key to the story is in how they responded. It was with faith. All night, they sang and prayed. And do you know what happened? God broke their chains!

So, if you're feeling scared or worried today, choose faith. Start worshipping God and giving Him your fears in prayer.

ACTION POINT: Find a few stories in the Bible where someone faced fear. Then, decide whether they responded with fight, flight, freeze. or faith.

ACTION POINT: If you need to, confess to God that you've "played with darkness," and talk to your mom about it. Then, pray together and ask God to help you live in the Light every day!

Fear of the Lord is the foundation of wisdom. Knowledge of the Holy One results in good judgment. { Proverbs 9:10 }

an I be honest with you? I've struggled with today's verse for a long time. I once thought, "We aren't supposed to fear!" The Bible actually tells us that perfect love casts out fear (1 John 4:18). So why does Scripture say the fear of the Lord results in wisdom?

It goes back to the beginning. God is kind and loving, but He is also just and fair. He created a perfect world. But when sin entered this world, it was no longer perfect. That's when God began to discipline His children, just like your mom and dad probably discipline you. Because of that discipline, we should have "fear" or respect for God.
