If it is helpful, you could decide you want to start by reading these together but we sure are hoping you will grow in your ability to read the Bible and understand it on your own. After all, someday you may be the mom who is helping a girl learn to do the very same thing!

re you successful? To be successful is to do well or have a favorable result. I'm a successful croissant baker. My daughter and I took six weeks to practice making them. At first, they were flat like pancakes. But eventually...we learned the secrets—use pastry flour, buy European butter, and be patient!

Joshua 1:8 says the way to success in life is to meditate on the Bible's words or God's instructions. Some translations tell us to do this, "and then you will have *good* success."

In the Bible, the word "good" tends to point our efforts towards helping others. I like to think "good success" means that my "favorable result" is useful to others, not just me. (Like when I shared those yummy croissants with my family!) To have *good* success in life, you need to read and obey God's Word.

But how do you keep your mind on it? You get creative! Memorize pieces of it. Read it every day. Select one verse to write on a sticky note and keep it where you'll see it. I challenge you to do that and see what *good* success God brings so that you're helpful to others.

ACTION POINT: Get a sticky note. Write Joshua 1:8 on it in the form of a prayer. Stick it somewhere so you can pray it all day long.

thought my dad knew everything. He could fix just about anything, always helped me with homework and projects, and was always there for me. One time I even bought him a little wooden sign for his workshop that reads, "Dear God, my dad can do everything, so if you need any help, you should ask him."

Even though I believed that my dad knew everything, all of us—including the wise adults in our lives like my father—have some things we don't know. None of us really has all of the answers.

But unlike us, our Heavenly Father has no limits to His knowledge and wisdom. The Bible is full of verses and stories that share the wisdom of God. As Job 12:13 states, "But true wisdom and power are found in God; counsel and understanding are His." It is from God that all wisdom comes, and only He has perfect knowledge.

When we ask God for His wisdom and learn about it through His Word, we are ready to make better decisions in life and positively impact those around us!

ACTION POINT: The next time you need some guidance, pick up your Bible and look for a verse that could be helpful. Share that verse with someone in your house and let them know God is always there for them!

You Are God's Masterpiece

And when He marked off the earth's foundations, I was the architect at His side.

{ Proverbs 8:29–30 }

y youngest daughter loved building things with her dad. She loved it so much that she designed and built sets for her high school theater department. Now she's doing it at her university. She's a bit of a carpenter!

You might remember that Jesus was a carpenter. But did you know He's also the architect of all creation? That's what Psalm 8 calls Him! The Bible also tells us that Jesus "existed in the beginning with God. God created everything through Him, and nothing was created except through Him" (John 1:2,3).

Not only is Jesus the architect of the whole universe, but He's also your designer. He made you wonderfully. In Psalm 139:14, the writer thanks God for making him. It reads: "Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! Your workmanship is marvelous—how well I know it."

If Jesus can design and build creation and you, then He can design and build your life too! Proverbs 8 begins with Wisdom calling out. That means Jesus is calling out to you! Will you listen to Him as He guides you through your circumstances and as you read your Bible? You can trust Him because He is Wisdom calling out to you!

ACTION POINT: Wisdom—that is, Jesus—is calling out to you!
Use your journal to write a prayer asking God to give you wisdom for a specific problem you are facing!

et's be real. All of us have gotten a lot of advice in our lives. Some of it we're grateful for, but some of it has probably made us roll our eyes. As we get older, we also get smarter, and sometimes we are tempted to think we don't need our mom's fashion advice or our dad's input on a school project.

{ James 1:5 }

used to be super shy. (If you know me now, you know how funny that is). Asking questions or telling others what I needed was hard for me, especially in school. If I didn't understand that day's assignment, I'd work my brain as hard as I could, trying to figure it out so I wouldn't have to ask the teacher. There were days when I left with my work unfinished and my questions unanswered. It was frustrating.

Asking for things seems like the scariest task in the world sometimes. It's not that the words are hard to form or say, but it's the fear of what lies on the other side of the question: the answer. How will they respond? Will they say no immediately? Will I be embarrassed? Maybe you've had this conversation in your head. I have. But it's one I try never to have when it comes to asking God for things.

God loves when we bring our needs to Him. Today's verse talks about asking for wisdom, and we sure need God's wisdom to live this life! His wisdom helps us make good choices, and He is more than willing to give it to us.

ACTION POINT: Have a conversation with God in your journal. Draw two chat bubbles side by side. In one, write a prayer asking God for His wisdom. In the other, write a big "Yes!" since James 1:5 tells us His answer.

Some people make cutting remarks, but the words of the wise bring healing. { Proverbs 12:18 }



ave you ever said anything mean to somebody? I sure have! I even lost a friendship once because of my words. My friend had just shared with me something incredible that had happened in her life. It was something I had been praying for in my life for a long time, but I was still waiting for it. When my friend told me her happy news, I didn't pause before I responded with, "That's not fair!" As soon as the words escaped my lips, I wished I could take them back. My words were cutting and hurtful.

Living wisely helps us to know we can pause before we react and be careful about what we say to each other. I remember my mom telling me, "You can catch more flies with honey than you can with vinegar." She was a wise woman and taught me that conversation should be gracious and attractive. Sweet words are so much better than sour/mean words!

Proverbs 12:18 tells us that words of the wise bring healing. A couple of years after that friendship ended, I asked my friend to forgive me. She did, and our relationship was restored!

ACTION POINT: Are you careful to pause before you respond to someone? Is your conversation gracious and attractive most of the time? If not, ask your mom for ideas on how you can be more careful to have a right response.

Don't be impressed with your own wisdom. Instead, fear the Lord and turn away from evil. { Proverbs 3:7 }

ach week my friends and I attend trivia night at a local restaurant. It's like playing Jeopardy in real life! We all bring different strengths to our team. There's our music, sports, and random facts experts, plus the friend who's great at boosting team spirit.

Most of the time, we agree on the answer. But sometimes, it gets a little heated when one of us thinks we know better than everyone else.

Sometimes that's me. More often than I'd like to admit. I think I know better than the people around me. Can you relate? Maybe you've never participated in a trivia night, but I'm not just talking about that anymore. It can be easy to think we're the smartest person in the room, no matter what room we're in. But Proverbs 3:7 tells us it's not a good idea to be impressed with our own wisdom.

When that happens, we become prideful and sometimes make bad choices because we don't listen to the wisdom of others. God promises to give us His wisdom if we ask for it (James 1:5), but sometimes we don't even bother to ask Him. That's when we need a mega-dose of humility. God knows better than we ever will, even on our best day. He'd be the ultimate trivia team member!

ACTION POINT: Set up a family trivia night and have everyone come up with a few questions from their favorite category. When it's time to play, ask God to help you have fun even if you're not the smartest in the room!

These are the proverbs of Solomon, David's son, king of Israel. Their purpose is to teach people wisdom and discipline, to help them understand the insights of the wise. { Proverbs 1:1-2 }

* The Book of Proverbs

he book of Proverbs is jam PACKED with wisdom. That is, it contains things that help us live sensibly and make good decisions. The entire book outlines general principles for living a wise life as we follow God.

In fact, the word wisdom appears in Proverbs more times than in any other book of the Bible. If you have a problem to solve, it has some good ideas for you to apply.

Here's a really cool idea so that those ideas will be in your mind when you need them. Proverbs contains 31 chapters. Because most months in the year also have 31 or 30 days, thousands of Christians around the world have adopted a habit of reading one chapter of Proverbs each day! For example, if it's May 17th, they read Proverbs 17. In fact, True Girl founder Dannah Gresh does this! She says that because she has read every verse in Proverbs so many times that the wisdom found in them now comes to mind when she has a problem to solve.

If you want to gain wisdom on just about ANYTHING you're faced with, Proverbs is the place to start!



ACTION POINT: Read the Proverb of the day for the next week!

"This is my command—be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." { loshua 1:9 }

y friend and True Girl, Julie, has fought a brave, long battle with cancer. It began in a hospital in a city called Morristown. As soon as the doctor told them, Julie began to use God's Word to build her faith for this fight. She wrote Joshua 1:9 on a piece of paper and stuck it to the wall. It was a bold declaration: I'm not going to be afraid because God's going with me into this battle.

Six-hundred and sixty-nine days later, Julie's mom was at a support group in New York City. One of the new moms shared the story of her son's diagnosis day. In the middle of all the bad news, there was—she reported with tears—a Bible verse hanging in her son's inpatient room when they arrived. Not just any Bible verse. One of their favorites: Joshua 1:9.

Julie's mom had to ask: Which hospital? Which room? But she already knew the answers.

Room 10.

Julie hadn't taken the verse down when she'd been urgently moved. And no one else took it down either...after all that time. It was a powerful reminder for them that God's always with us!

ACTION POINT: Keeping God's Word in front of you isn't just helpful to you. Sometimes God uses your notes, posters, and coloring pages to encourage others. Put a favorite verse on your bedroom door and pray God uses it in your home.

used to love make-believe. Sometimes I'd play "high school," where I'd pack my backpack with my heaviest books and jog to my locker. Other times I'd pretend I was skateboarding in a competition's finals. It felt so good when I'd stick an awesome trick and win the ginormous trophy!

My all-time favorite game was with my brother. He'd man the bridge that led to the coolest city just beyond the living room. He wouldn't grant me access until I answered all of his questions and solved every riddle he had. He held the key, and only he could let me enter after I demonstrated understanding.

In real life, only God can give us wisdom, knowledge, and understanding. Just like Proverbs 2:6 says. And He's way more willing to than my brother was at that city gate!

The world tries to sell us on ways to gain "wisdom." College, books, documentaries—you name it. While all these things give information on certain subjects and situations, true wisdom and knowledge come from God alone. He's the one who opens our eyes to our need for His wisdom and understanding. He's the one who grants us just that when we submit ourselves to Him and simply ask.

ACTION POINT: Have you asked the Lord for His wisdom in your life? If you haven't, write a prayer in your journal to Him humbly asking. If you have, thank Him for His promise to grant that wisdom to you.

Pray Like This

Pray like this...
{ Matthew 6:9 }

'Il never forget when my friend said, "I wish I had someone to pray with who really knew how to pray." At first, I was angry. She didn't think I knew how to pray!?! But then I saw it was true. Instead of continuing to stay quiet during group prayer, I decided to learn how to pray.

Prayer is something we can practice and improve at. There are some guidelines, but there's a lot of freedom too. When Jesus taught His disciples to pray, He pointed out a couple of distinct blunders.

First, Jesus shared praying in public to show off isn't His method. He'd rather have a private conversation. He says it like this:

"But when you pray, go away by yourself, shut the door behind you, and pray to your Father in private. Then your Father, who sees everything, will reward you." (Matthew 6:6)

Second, Jesus explained that we don't have to say the same thing over and over again. Our all-powerful King doesn't need instruction on handling our needs.


"When you pray, don't babble on and on...for your Father knows exactly what you need even before you ask Him!" (Matthew 6:7–8)

ACTION POINT: Are you willing to be a student? Take a few moments to ask God to teach you how to pray, and spend time looking up verses on prayer.

Their ears are open for knowledge.
{ Proverbs 18:15 }



Now, I'm not going to lie. About 98% of the time, I have *not* felt like that. Sometimes I counted down the minutes until lunch or recess. But, for me, history class was different. I was always ready to learn and take in as much as I could.

Proverbs 18:15 teaches us that you will remember so much more when you have an open heart to hear what you are being taught and are ready to learn. You become passionate about what you are studying!

Imagine if we all were that excited to learn about wisdom. What if we spent time learning about wisdom or about people who have had a lot of insight and understanding, like Solomon or maybe your grandparents? Well, I think we would all be a little wiser!

* Wanna Be Wise? Seek Knowledge!

"For this is how God loved the world: He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life."

{ John 3:16 }

ho is the wisest person you know? In the Bible, there was a religious leader named Nicodemus, who many regarded as the wisest person. He spent his whole life studying God's laws and sharing them with others.

When Jesus began performing miracles, many doubted that He could truly be the son of God. Even Nicodemus. He was scared that Jesus could be a fake! But Nicodemus began to see Jesus' power and was wise enough to dig deeper and seek knowledge!

So, in the middle of the night, Nicodemus went to Jesus and asked him questions about being born again. Because Nicodemus wanted to learn from Him, Jesus was able to reply with the words from John 3:16 that we hold so close today.

Like Nicodemus, if we want to be wise, it's important to keep seeking knowledge. We might not be able to visit Jesus face-to-face in the night, but we can learn SO much from Jesus by reading His Word and praying every single day!

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom to read through John 3 with you and discuss what it means. If she's busy right now, ask if there's a time that works later or read through it on your own!

When people do not accept divine guidance, they run wild. But whoever obeys the law is joyful. { Proverbs 29:18 }



n a conversation between Winnie the Pooh and Piglet,
Piglet sits close to Pooh. "Pooh," he whispers. "Yes, Piglet?"
"Nothing," says Piglet. "I just wanted to be sure of you."

I want you to be sure of *God*. Don't get too far ahead in your dreams, plans, or opinions. Take them to God, and He will give you divine guidance.

What's *divine guidance*? People we read about in the Bible had visions. Abraham, Paul, and Peter had them. Were they plans made by people? Were they thoughts or creative ideas? Were they opinions? No! They were things God revealed to them.

Today, we have an entire collection of books with divine guidance. We call it the Bible. Rather than running wildly, people who read what God reveals in the Bible are joyful. Stay close to God and His Word, and you'll have divine guidance.

If you see the news, you know some people are mad. Sometimes it gets so bad they run wildly, shouting their opinions and doing unkind things to others. That's what happens when people don't accept divine guidance. Don't be one of them. Read your Bible and accept what God says as true. Be sure of Him.

ACTION POINT: Sit close to God today. Find a few quiet minutes and talk to Him softly. Just say, "God, I want to be sure of You. Can you help me to know that You are there?"

* First Things First

Get wisdom; develop good judgment. Don't forget my words or turn away from them. { Proverbs 4:5 }

f you've heard of King Solomon, you also probably know how wealthy and successful he was. But, believe it or not, those things only came after he asked God for one thing: wisdom.

You see, King Solomon was the son of King David. Yep, the same David that killed Goliath! You would think that the first thing a king would teach his heir was to go after more power and riches. Nope. Not David. In Proverbs 4, Solomon shares how David taught him to seek God's wisdom above everything else.

David knew that with wisdom, God would show Solomon how to make good decisions. Those wise choices were worth more than any material thing. And guess what? Not only did Solomon listen to his father, but in Proverbs 4:5, we get to see him teaching others these same principles. Now that's wise!

ACTION POINT: Sometimes we make decisions too quickly. Next time you see a friend about to make a hasty decision, ask if you can pray with them for God's wisdom. If we get wisdom first, it could save us from future problems.

So be careful how you live. Don't live like fools, but like those who are wise. { Ephesians 5:15 }



el pens were all the rave in elementary school, and I had the biggest collection. So, you can imagine my surprise when it went missing. After checking everywhere, I finally found a few of my pens on a classmate's desk. She'd taken my collection and was using it. I. Was. Heated.

I asked her nicely to return it. At first, she acted confused. But once she realized I wasn't going to let it go, she said they were hers now. She'd been somewhat of a bully to me before, but this was the last straw. Before I knew it, my fist had made contact with her nose and she was crying. I'd punched someone over gel pens. How unbelievably ridiculous.

While that isn't one of my finer moments, it's a good reminder to me of how not to walk in this life. As Jesus' followers, we're called to live differently than others. Ephesians 5:15 says, "be careful how you live." Our behavior should reflect that of a wise person—someone who's anchored in and guided by Christ and His love. We should act in a way that pushes others towards Jesus and His way of walking wisely.

ACTION POINT: Reflect on your actions lately. How have you encouraged the unwise behaviors of the world (things like lying, cheating, arguing, etc.)? Write a prayer in your journal confessing. them to God and asking Him to help you walk wisely.

* Infinite Wisdom

God gave Solomon very great wisdom and understanding, and knowledge as vast as the sands of the seashore.

{ I Kings 4:29 }

ave you ever tried to count the sand on the beach? I shore haven't because, well, to be honest, I would be overwhelmed even trying to count five of those tiny little things.

Take Santa Barbara Beach, for example. It is one mile long. That's a long way. Now, I tried to calculate the number of sand pieces that could be there, but I couldn't even do that. So I think it is safe for us to assume that THERE IS A LOT OF SAND.

This means our friend Solomon must have had α lot of wisdom. Because in I Kings 4:29 we learn that it was so plentiful it was like the sands on a seashore. That's a good thing since he was a king, and he needed all that wisdom to lead God's people well!

God's wisdom is beyond our understanding. You couldn't even measure it if you wanted to! And, as we grow closer to Him, He begins to reveal His heart to us and gives us more knowledge and insight to understand His plan better.

ACTION POINT: Write a prayer in your journal. Ask the Lord to give you wisdom and understanding the same way He did for Solomon!

icture this: God appears to you in a dream and tells you He'll give you ANYTHING you want. No tricks, no exceptions. What would you ask for? Maybe a better home for your family? A trip to Paris? The new puppy you've been begging your parents for?

Okay, this scenario doesn't seem too realistic, does it? But it *did* happen to King Solomon in the Old Testament! He loved God with all his heart. He tried his best to be a good king, but he was inexperienced and needed help. One night, God appeared to him while he was sleeping and said, "What do you want? Ask, and I will give it to you!" (I Kings 3:5).

Solomon considered God's offer and then requested something that might surprise you. He asked for *wisdom*. He could have had all the money in the world or the power to rule every kingdom. But he knew that God's wisdom was more valuable. God gave Solomon the insight and knowledge he asked for, and you know what? He was so pleased with Solomon's request that he also gave him the things he *didn't* ask for, like riches and a big kingdom!

ACTION POINT: Think about the things you ask God for when you pray. Is his wisdom on the list? If not, spend some time requesting that he give you wisdom and an understanding heart.

hen she was little, my daughter had seen a commercial for a certain brand of sneakers. They needed a way to communicate with the outside world—and FAST. They came up with a perfect idea: send their mail in balloons!

It's hard to imagine living in a time where we had to wait weeks for the mail. Although we no longer transport mail by way of helium, now we can order items online and have them on our doorsteps the next day through the power of airmail. We live in a FAST world. Fast food, fast internet, fast checkout...but we need to remember that God says the wise will still practice patience. In fact, it's better to be patient than powerful.

Maybe you remember learning how God's people waited HUNDREDS of years for the Messiah to appear. If they could wait THAT long for Jesus, surely we can patiently sit through our younger sibling's soccer game with a smile, wait until everyone is seated to start dinner, and stand in long lines at the amusement park without complaining.

ACTION POINT: Think about something you're waiting for. Maybe it's a big trip, more freedom, or a new experience. Journal about what you can do to make the wait easier.

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* Day and Night

But they delight in the law of the LORD, meditating on it day and night. { Psalm 1:2 }

ave you ever gotten a song stuck in your head? Like really stuck? You even have trouble falling asleep because the music and lyrics keep playing in your mind, and you wake up singing. It's never the whole tune, though, just a part of it. So you keep trying to think of what the next words are. (I can never remember the next part, though! Can you?)

This is how we should be with the Word of God! Psalm 1:2 tells us to meditate on it day and night. We should be thinking about God's Word, not just when reading the Bible and studying it, but all of the time. It isn't just a song we can't get out of our heads. It's His message to us. God's Word can teach us and help us grow to be more like Him when we meditate on it.

ACTION POINT: Combine the power of a song and meditating on Bible verses. Make a song out of a verse or find one that's already written. Sing it and get it stuck in your head. If you need help, one of our former True Girl tour members (Abby Houston) now helps girls memorize Bible verses by writing music to go with them. Find her Melodically Memorizing albums on spotify.

ACTION POINT: What's one way you're walking with wisdom from above? If you're having a hard time doing it, that's okay. Talk to your mom about it and pray together. Ask God to give you wisdom from above today.

piders...eek!! They are scary, fast, and give me goosebumps. Yes, I am afraid of them! I used to be scared of God too. I thought He'd be mad and punish me when I did wrong things or had bad thoughts. But then I read a verse in my Bible that talks about a different kind of fear—the fear of the Lord. As I studied what this meant, I realized I had it all wrong. He isn't a scary God who makes me anxious. He is quite the opposite.

The fear of the Lord means "reverence" or a feeling of deep respect. When I fear God, I have affection for Him. He loves me more than I could ever imagine and wants good things for me. If I understand this. I can find the wisdom in His Word and see His love for me. I can know what is true and right because the Bible shows me.

Now, I'm excited to read my Bible and about how awesome God has made me to be. Because He loves me, I want to praise Him for who He is and what He means to me.

ACTION POINT: In your journal, write a list of God's awesome qualities that cause you to fear Him in reverence. These characteristics might include His power, presence, and love.

Often, we take our hard questions to the internet or friends our age. The problem is these aren't always good fountains of wisdom. Even if our friends love Jesus a lot, they're still learning and may get it wrong sometimes too.

Proverbs 9:10 reminds us that God is "the foundation of wisdom." But going to Him for advice is hard. Answers don't fall from heaven as clear as the TV's volume or our friends' voices. So how can we hear from Him? Here are four steps to help you get God's wisdom:

- 1. Through the Holy Spirit: He speaks to your heart. You can feel peace and joy when something comes from God. Or fear, confusion, and sadness when it doesn't.
 - 2. Through His Word: It's where He clearly says what's good or bad.
- 3. Through the body of Christ: Your parents, pastors, and godly teachers are great examples!
- 4. Circumstances: When things and opportunities align with the last three steps.

ACTION POINT: Think about a decision you have to make or an answer you need from God. Go through these four steps and write in your journal about what wisdom God might be giving you.



"Your eye is like a lamp that provides light for your body. When your eye is healthy, your whole body is filled with light. But when your eye is unhealthy, your whole body is filled with darkness."



ver since Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit in the Garden of Eden, there's been darkness and evil all around us. So a trait of a wise Christian is saying NO to darkness and YES to light!

One way we can do this is through our eyes! They're a powerful part of our body. Matthew 6 says that they are like a lamp that provides light for our whole body. The things we see affect our hearts. So we have to BE careful what we let our eyes see. When the games, music, TV shows, or movies we watch are dark, our hearts can quickly become full of darkness. If we want a kind, loving, and wise heart, we need to focus our eyes on kind, loving, and wise things. And, if we're not sure what those things are, God's Word and the godly people He's put into our lives can help us.

The wise girl can tell her friends she'd rather not watch a horror movie or play games that give her an icky feeling in her stomach. The wise girl's eyes are focused on media that helps her fill her heart with light and not darkness!

ACTION POINT: Think about the shows and videos you watch. Are there any that are more focused on darkness than light? Replace them with something that will make you more kind, loving, and wise. You might try the True Girl YouTube channel!

And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of His return is drawing near.

{ Hebrews 10:25 }

hy is going to church such a big deal? Do we really have to go at all? Well, it's important enough that God included this passage in Hebrews telling us not to "neglect our meeting together, as some people do."

Spending time with other believers is a tremendous advantage. When we feel alone in what we believe, we can grow weak. When surrounded by others who share our beliefs, we have a strength we could never have on our own. ACTION POINT: If church seems "boring" to you, sing during worship and take notes during the sermon. Do this for one month and see if it feels different!

* Putting God First

Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and He will give you everything you need.
{ Matthew 6:33 }

hen we seek God's Kingdom first—that is, we obey Him and do what's written in His Word—He gives us everything else we need.

When I was fourteen, I felt like God wanted me to spend all summer helping a ministry teach children about Jesus. I wasn't old enough to be a teacher, so I volunteered as a helper. That same summer, my friends went to the beach and planned cool things. I felt a little left out, but I believed that as I sought God's kingdom first, "all these things" would be given to me too. "All these things" meant some fun and sun.

So, I asked God to give me a break and some fun. He blessed me with a scholarship to a Christian camp. I went caving, rock climbing, horseback riding, and tried my hand at archery, self-defense, and candle-making.

* Who Is Wisdom?

Wisdom shouts in the streets.

She cries out in the public square.

{ Proverbs 1:20 }

y pastor's favorite children's message begins with this question: "What's brown, furry, eats nuts, and climbs trees?" The last time he taught it, the children raised their hands, eager to answer. But there was a girl who couldn't contain her excitement. She shouted out, "[ESUS!"

Wait! What? Sure, she knew the answer was "squirrel." But she also remembered that he brings every story back to the most important answer: Jesus.

When you read today's verse, you might ask, "Who is Wisdom?" In this case, you would be correct if you shouted out, "Jesus!" Jesus said this about Himself in John 5:39: "You search the Scriptures because you think they give you eternal life. But the Scriptures point to me!" Who is Wisdom? JESUS! Jesus is wisdom.

Bonus question: why is the feminine pronoun *she* used in Proverbs 1:20? Well, sometimes a language gives pronouns to words. In Hebrew, the language of the Old Testament, the word "wisdom" is a feminine word. It has nothing to do with gender. It's just how their language works.

> ACTION POINT: Read Proverbs 1 again and this time replace the word "wisdom" with "Jesus."

{ Genesis 1:27 }



eady for a great big Latin vocab lesson? This month I want you to learn about *imago Dei*. It's pronounced like *ei-mago day*. And it means "image of God." This concept comes from Genesis 1:27, which tells us clearly that we're made in the image of God. Here are two things you need to know about *imago Dei*.

1. We're a lot like God.

In the same way that we can be like our parents, many things about us are like God. We think smart stuff in ways other mammals can't. Our hearts and minds bond with other humans through emotional connection. Even our bodies are created to do helpful and amazing things. These things are like God.

2. We aren't like any other created being.

Animals aren't smart in the same way we are, and don't have many of the things that make us useful. (Take for example, thumbs! Sometimes I wish my dog had thumbs so he could help me carry things.)

Because we're like God, we're very special. Even more special than the angels (Hebrews 1:1–14). And because we're that special, we have to take extra care to represent God well.

ACTION POINT: Write a few ways that you are like your parents in your prayer journal. Then, write a few ways that you are like God.

So Jesus explained, "I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself. He does only what he sees the Father doing. Whatever the Father does, the Son also does."

{ John 5:19 }

here's a saying: Imitation is the highest form of flattery.
Can you imagine how God must have felt watching Jesus fulfill His will on this Earth? Jesus wasn't walking around doing His own "good" things. He only did what He saw His Father God do. I don't know if God blushes, but if He did, I'm sure watching His Son imitate Him made His cheeks rosy!

ou may know the story of the Good Samaritan. If you don't, no worries. But you might want to read Luke 10:25–37 before you keep reading today's devo.

The Samaritan in this story is unique because he took care of a Jewish man he very easily could have passed. He was selfless and merciful. He showed grace when he really didn't have to. was so excited to get my new magazine in the mail! As I flipped through the pages, I couldn't help but notice the pictures of all the girls, each one looking so perfect and beautiful. I admired their flawless hair and fancy clothing and started to feel a little jealousy towards each of them. Before I realized it, I had spent over an hour idolizing the girls throughout my magazine. While I wanted to keep looking, I reluctantly put it down and moved on to do something else.

Does this sound familiar??

It is so easy to get caught up admiring girls that we see in magazines or on ty, allowing them to become false idols in our lives. We become obsessed with how they look or how they live their lives and each day we try to become more and more like them.

This is what God is referring to when he warns us to not "trust in idols or make metal images of gods." Instead, we need to turn to our Bibles and try to live a life that is reflective of the love that God has for us. He has shaped us in His image and we are perfect in His sight. No need to turn to others to prove who we are!

ACTION POINT: The next time you find yourself obsessing over how others look in one of your magazines or on tv, grab your Bible. Make a list of verses that show how we are shaped in the image of God. Pick a few of your favorite verses and using some sticky notes, place those verses around your house so you can see them throughout the day!

* Race Against Evil

Don't let evil conquer you, but conquer evil by doing good. { Romans 12:21 }

o you know anything about Adolf Hitler? He was an evil ruler in Germany in the early 1900s. He hated people of different races and religions. He wanted to prove to the world that people of other races were inferior—or not as good as—people like him. To prove his point, he hosted the 1936 Olympics in Berlin. He was hoping that his "perfect" athletes would win all the medals, leaving athletes of other colors and religions in their dust.

But there was Jesse Owens. This African-American man from Alabama proved Hitler wrong because he ended up winning four gold medals right in front of Hitler's eye in the 100-meter dash, long jump, 200-meter dash, and 400-meter relay, setting three records and tying one! Hitler refused to shake Jesse Owens' hand in congratulations for his amazing accomplishments, but no one was surprised.

The sad thing here is that Hitler didn't understand that Jesse Owens was just as reflective of God's image as anyone else was. Hitler had a distorted view of the *imago Dei*. God has created all of us to bear His image. When we look at others, we should recognize that the Lord created them too!

ACTION POINT: Think of someone different from you. (Maybe they play a different sport, or maybe they wear glasses!) What quality in their life do you see reflecting God's character? Share it with them!

uby Bridges was just a six-year-old girl when she made history. In 1960, the Civil Rights Movement was in full swing, and the sin of racism was prevalent throughout America. Black people were forced to drink from separate water fountains, ride different buses, and swim in different pools than white people. This was known as segregation. Many white people had forgotten that black people were made in the image of God.

On March 14th, 1960, Ruby was the first black child to go to an all-white school. Many white people protested outside, her dad was fired from his job, and people threatened her family for months. But Ruby stayed strong and didn't miss a single day of school all year.

When people read the news that day and saw a photo of Ruby walking into school, it was a beautiful reminder of *imago Dei*. God never wanted us to be separated from others because of our skin, past, or personality. Just like Ruby getting the same access to education as white children, when God made us, He gave us ALL equal access to come to Him through Jesus.

ACTION POINT: Think of a time in the Bible or in history when a person or people group weren't treated like they were made in the Image of God.

{ James 3:7-9 }

eacocks are on the wildish side. But they are nice to have around. They eat nasty things like ticks and other bugs that could cause sicknesses to horses, goats, and llamas. But if you try to capture one, it will flap, flutter, squawk, and slap you with its wings. They are wildish.

Do you have a wild tongue? The Bible claims that you can tame all kinds of animals, but no one can tame the tongue. One day it praises God. The next day it says terrible things to someone who is the image of God! (*Imago Dei!*) James 3:10 says: "...blessing and cursing come pouring out of the same mouth. Surely, my brothers and sisters, this is not right!"

You know what? We've tamed our peacocks. Sometimes I need to handle them to give them medicine and care or keep them safe from predators or weather. So, Farmer Bob (my husband) sits in that cage with them for many weeks and throws them peanuts. They learn to trust us before we let them roam freely on our farm.

If Farmer Bob can tame a peacock, you and I can certainly tame our tongues.

ACTION POINT: Is your tongue tame? What do you need to do to make it more of a blessing to those who are created in God's image? Write about it in your journal.

O FIREWORKS ALLOWED. \$500 FINE." That was the first sign I read when I got to the park. While I was still standing there, a man came up behind me and read the sign out loud. He added his own commentary saying, "Oh, so you can set off fireworks, it'll just cost you \$500. That's not too bad."

Wow! What a mindset. In our world, money can make a difference in how people live and are treated. The punishment that seemed like a really big deal to me was just an inconvenience to him. So, he was willing to twist the rules.

Way back in the Old Testament. God knew that this would be a problem, so He laid out some pretty clear instructions that were supposed to help protect people from being judged based on how much money they had. Leviticus 19:15 says that when it comes to legal matters, there should not be favor or extra allowances for someone who is rich. That idea is true even outside a courtroom. Treating people the same no matter their wealth, race, abilities, and so on is extremely important because we're all made in God's image.

ACTION POINT: Have you ever considered how much money someone has while deciding how to treat them? If so, write a prayer in your journal asking God to help you see everyone the way He sees them.

rack those knuckles, stretch those arms, and strap on your thinking cap because it's time for a POP QUIZ!!! You didn't know I was taking you to class today, did ya? First and only word up on the list: sanctification. You've probably heard it before, and I'm here to tell you don't be afraid of it! Sometimes big words are thrown around in church, but we can handle them!

Sanctification is the process of becoming more like Jesus. It's the moment-by-moment work the Holy Spirit does within our hearts to help us look more like lesus in the things we say and do, and in the way we see others.

The thing about sanctification is that it's a journey that won't be completed in this life. Just like Paul mentions in today's verse, it will be complete when we become heavenly citizens. We should be further along on the process each day we live down here, but we won't complete the course until we're face to face with Jesus.

So have grace with yourself along the journey! Jesus sure does. He's simply pleased you've given your heart to Him and desire for His Spirit to continue His work in you.

ACTION POINT: Reflect on how you've changed for the better since giving your heart to Jesus. If you haven't made that decision yet, maybe today is the day. Talk about it with your mom or a trusted adult.

id you know that in the ancient world, nations often had false gods that they worshipped? Many of these people would build golden and wooden statues called idols to represent the gods they served. ACTION POINT: Spend some time worshipping God. You could sing your favorite praise song or read a passage of Scripture like Psalm 150 out loud. Then, thank God for making you in His image!

looked at my four-year-old daughter, wearing a denim jumper and pink shirt, and compared her to a picture of another brown-eyed girl wearing a similar outfit. It was me! Thirty years might separate us, but she is the spitting image of me, right down to the eyebrows!

God made you. He created you. (That's one reason why we should follow His commands.) And He made us to be a lot like Him. What amazed me was how they'd truly surprised me. I'd been so unaware before my blindfold was removed. But once it was gone, I saw everything clearly.



But once we accept Jesus into our heart, the blindfold's removed and we sin our sin and God's goodness.

Mat Jesus has removed your blindfold. Maybe they're things you used to do like taking items that weren't yours or disobeying your parents. Thank Jesus that He's removed the veil from your eyes.

here are many theories or ideas about how the earth came to be. One is the Big Bang Theory, which claims that the universe began billions of years ago. The scientists who believe this say the world we live in had just a few tiny atoms that bumped into each other and blew up. Thus, the name "Big Bang."

Just because a scientist or a teacher says something doesn't make it true. (Even if it were true, where did those first few atoms come from? Science can't explain that.)

We believe that God created the universe possibly as recently as 6,000 years ago. When we believe that God created the world and us, we can know that we didn't happen by accident. God made us on purpose and in His image—including you. Nothing about you was accidental. He chose your hair color, eye color, skin color, personality, and intellect. And He did it all on purpose.

You will bump into people who believe in the Big Bang Theory. But you can be confident that it takes as much faith (or more) to believe in those ideas as it does to believe that God created this world. (And you!)

ACTION POINT: Talk to your mom or dad about how to respond when someone tries to teach you that the world was not created by a good and loving God.

t the beginning of the school year, my daughter's teacher emailed all of the parents. ACTION POINT: Think about the people that you don't get along with. Write a list of ways you can show them love. At the top of the list, write PRAYER. It's a lot harder to dislike someone when you're praying for them!

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






* Help Someone

- Cornell University discovered older people who spent their free time volunteering had fewer health problems than those who did not volunteer.
- One research project proved that men who demonstrated self-centered thinking by overusing words like I, me, my, and mine were far more likely to suffer from heart attacks. It wasn't the words themselves that caused the danger, but the selfish living.
- * A final study at Harvard University helped us learn that students had a stronger ability to fight sickness after just watching videos of someone caring for orphans in Calcutta, India. After the film, the saliva collected from student's mouths had sickness fighting power...from just watching someone serve.

ometimes it's easy to say unkind things about other people when they're not listening or we don't know them. I've caught myself watching someone and thinking or saying words that tear them down instead of building them up. I once read a novel about a girl who struggled with this too, and a good friend taught her an important lesson. Her friend gently asked her: "Did you know that girl you're criticizing is made in the image of God? When you're saying bad things about her, you are actually saying bad things about God and His work!"

Just like the girl in the story and me, maybe you've done this too. When we are tempted to judge others, we can remind ourselves that if God is perfect, He never makes mistakes. That means that since He made us and those around us, we are PERFECTLY made. And, not just that, He chiseled us—His masterpieces—with Himself in mind. The truth that He made us in His image changes how we see and treat ourselves and each other.

the Belt of Truth

Stand your ground, putting on the belt of truth. { Ephesians 6:14 }

'm a big fan of belts. One of my favorite belts has a fancy peacock feather over the buckle. It is easy for me to picture the Belt of Truth as being brown leather with shiny silver studs on it. But I found out that's not really the kind of belt scripture is talking about. In the original language it says something more like, "have your loins gird about with truth."

In the Bible days, the people wore a piece of clothing called a tunic, something like a dress or robe. Over top of that they wore a belt-like thing called a girdle. The girdle kept the tunic in place throughout the day. Sometimes the tunic's length got in the way of work or battle, so the people would "gird up their loins" by bringing the bottom of their tunic and tucking it into the girdle (belt). This way they wouldn't trip on the long fabric of the tunic.

We need to make sure we know the truth of God's Word, or we can be easily tripped up by all the lies floating around us!

> ACTION POINT: Put on the "bett of Truth" this morning, so that when the time to battle comes, you'll be ready to fight!

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
