With that in mind, this month's theme Bible Basics  
Bootcamp is VERY practical, teaching you and your  
daughter about the actual structure of the Bible. This is  
the portion of scripture we're using as our foundation:

All Scripture is inspired by God and is  
useful to teach us what is true and to make us  
realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects  
us when we are wrong and teaches us to  
do what is right. God uses it to prepare and  
equip his people to do every good work.

The Word of God is incredibly useful for teaching,  
convicting, correcting, preparing and equipping us  
but if we don't know how to use it, well...that can  
feel pretty overwhelming.

As you go through the content this month, try

# Preparing for your June Mom+Daughter Date

## THE BIBLE IS NOT TOO BIG FOR YOU!

### SUBJECT:

My Bible, My Friend

### SETTING:

Anywhere you like!

### MATERIALS YOU'LL NEED:

A bucket or container

One pair of scissors

A pen or pencil

Your Bibles



These activities are all about helping your daughter learn and understand some of the structure of the Bible itself. This will help her feel more comfortable using it!

**Watch Staci's coaching video.** In her wonderful Staci-style, she'll talk about the beauty and importance of knowing what's in your Bible.

**Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17.** You might find the NLT version easiest for your daughter to understand. Discuss these questions:

- ♥ Make a list of all the things this scripture says the Word of God is useful for.
- ♥ What do you think it means that scripture is "inspired by God" or "God-breathed"? (Vs 16)
- ♥ What does verse 17 say the word of God does for us?
- ♥ Talk about ways scripture prepares and equips us for God's work. (Maybe talk about either a real or hypothetical situation that may occur at school.)

**Play "Old or New Testament?"**

- ♥ Begin by looking at the table of contents in the front of your Bible. This is the place that lists all the page numbers where you can find the books in the Old Testament and then all the books and pages of the New Testament. Take turns reading the names out loud. (i.e. Mom, you might read the word "Genesis" and then your Daughter reads "Exodus" and you keep going back and forth all the way to Revelation.) Some of those names are tricky but don't feel bad if you don't quite know how to read them. Just do your best!
- ♥ Now cut out each of the names of the books of the Bible from the printable sheet we sent you. Just cut along those dotted lines. Fold each slip of paper in half and put them all in a bucket or container.
- ♥ Take turns pulling a book of the Bible out of the bucket. Read the book name out loud and then say whether it can be found in the Old Testament or the New Testament! You don't have to do all 66 books at one time. You could even keep the bucket out on the kitchen counter and quiz each other, or other family members, at random times!
