Your Worry Alarm

Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank Him for all He has done. Then you will experience God's peace... { Philippians 4:6–7 }

o you ever lay awake in bed at night and think crazy thoughts? Did I study long enough to pass my test tomorrow? Did I put my computer charger in my bag so I won't forget it? Will I get home in time to let Moosie out to...you know...go?

Sometimes I think worrisome thoughts give birth to each other. Well, guess what they're supposed to give birth to? PRAYER! Philippians 4:6–7 says not to worry about anything but to pray about everything.

What if we started to think of our worry as an alarm clock signaling that it's time to pray? Just like an alarm clock wakes us up in the morning, our worry should act as a reminder to pray. If you tell God what you need and thank Him for what He has done, you'll give birth to peace instead of more worrisome thoughts!

Trust me! I've tried this. It works.

ACTION POINT: The next time you start to feel afraid or worried, think of it as a worry alarm clock. It's telling you to talk to God! So, do just that!

bout 800 tornadoes touch down in the United States. every year. Twisters are extremely dangerous, and you need to take cover if one heads your way, but did you know about the eye in the center of it? It's a place in the middle of a circular storm that's relatively peaceful.

A couple of people have experienced actually standing in a tornado's eye. In 1928, a twister was coming toward Will Keller's house in Kansas. He stayed outside to observe the violent storm. (I'm not sure that was a great idea.) Somehow he managed to hold his ground as the tornado surrounded him. When he was in the center of it, he noticed everything was still. Isn't it magnificent that something so destructive could have a place of total stillness in its middle?

I think that's a lot like God's peace. His peace doesn't promise there won't be storms or hard times in our lives. But God does promise strength during any circumstance. Philippians 4:7 tells us that God's peace is still there when we don't understand what's going on. It also says that His peace guards our hearts and minds in Christ lesus. Even in the storms of our lives!

ACTION POINT: What storm are you facing right now? It doesn't have to be a real tornado for you to experience God's peace. Write a prayer and ask God to help you experience Him in the middle of your problem.

Listen Up!

Now may the Lord of peace Himself give you His peace at all times and in every situation. The Lord be with you all. { 2 Thessalonians 3:16 }

ave you ever gotten sad news? I remember the day my dad died. I was visiting my son at his home just a few minutes from the beach. After hearing the news, we were both so sad and cried together for a long time, but we decided to keep our plans and head to the beach.

My sadness didn't leave on that beach, but I always feel God's presence and peace more deeply when I'm there. There's something about listening to the waves crash as they come in to gently lap at my feet, or looking out towards the ocean as I walk in the sand. Those things give me peace and make me think all's right with the world even when it isn't.

I'm amazed that no matter how stressed or overwhelmed I am. I only need to hear or see those waves, and I'm at peace. And on that day when I got the sad news, I knew, without a doubt, that God was with me. I heard Him in the waves and felt Him all around me. His peace was with me.

ACTION POINT: Is there a place or a sound that makes you forget about something stressful going on in your life and brings you peace? Think about what it is and share it with your mom or write it in your journal.

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I listen carefully to what God the LORD is saying, for He speaks peace to His faithful people. But let them not return to their foolish ways. { Psalms 85:8 }

up, that's it...easy...good! Just like that!" My dad usually said this as he taught me carpentry skills. My family owned a construction company, so I spent lots of time helping on different job sites. I loved it!

There were lots of rules on the site. Listening carefully was an extra important one. If you were learning to use a new tool or someone was warning you to move out of the way quickly, but you weren't listening, it could result in injury.

This memory helps me as I practice listening to God. If I think of God as the contractor, the world as His job site, and me as His visitor, I realize it's important for me to carefully listen to navigate the site. When we faithfully seek God and desire to listen to Him carefully, we safely learn and grow.

ACTION POINT: Are you a good listener? Ask your mom or the adult you live with if they think you listen well. If you are, keep it up! If you're not, spend some time asking God to help you listen to Him better and your parents too! After all, He's the one who put them in charge of you to keep you safe as you grow.

am a planner! I love to know exactly what will happen and when it will happen. But sometimes, I plan WAY ahead, and it can leave me disappointed when things don't go exactly as I expected.

Planning has also kept me from enjoying the right-now moments because I'm too focused on what I will do tomorrow. I often look back and wish I would have enjoyed the moment more.

Right now, I'm currently on tour with True Girl. The other day. I caught myself thinking and wondering what I would do after the tour. 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Peace Is Our Umpire

And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts.

For as members of one body you are called to live in peace...

{ Colossians 3:15 }

o you have siblings? I'm a mom to three daughters. Even though my girls are close, they still argue. (If you have a sister or brother, I'm sure you get it!) Sometimes I feel like an umpire between competing sports teams. (Your mom may get this one!)

Since our family learns Scripture verses for skills needing "practice," Matthew 5:9 was a perfect verse. It says, "Blessed are the peacemakers..." Each time arguments began, my girls simply quoted their verse. However, one day I heard one daughter say, "peacemakers." Then another said louder, "NO! I'M THE PEACEMAKER!" Yep. They argued about being peacemakers!

As an umpire-mom, I called a "timeout" on that play and coached them with God's truth that we are not on opposing teams. Together we team up with Jesus against our opposing enemy—the devil. When peacemakers fight *for* not *against* each other, everybody wins!

Colossians 3:15 coaches us to "let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts..." The word RULE means "to umpire." Inviting the Prince of Peace (Jesus) to be the Umpire of our hearts and homes is the game-changer for peacemaking!

ACTION POINT: How can your family fight for not against each other? If you are like us and need to practice peacemaking, read these verses and choose one to learn by heart: Matthew 5:9. Romans 12:18, Hebrews 12:14, or Colossians 3:15.

was eleven years old when I finally made it to "the Happiest Place on Earth." Yup, Disney World! My family had an exciting day riding rides, visiting EPCOT, and taking pictures with Disney characters. As we were winding down in our hotel that night, a warning came across the TV: TORNADO ALERT!

We were all shaken up. Not only were we worried about the tornado, but we were also on a higher floor of a tall hotel. As we scrambled to prepare for this possible emergency, my mom stopped us. She said, "Let's pray." She told the tornado to go away in Jesus' name and asked God for His peace and protection. After that prayer, we calmed down and enjoyed some family time, eventually falling asleep together in one bed.

The tornado never came, and I learned a valuable lesson. We can command peace in our lives through the power of Jesus. When things seem crazy around us, we can pray for peace. God can bring that peace in many different ways. We just need to have faith that He will.

ACTION POINT: Draw a before-and-after picture of you commanding a storm to stop in Jesus' name. It could be rain turning into sunshine or a tornado shrinking. Remember that the One who calms the storm lives inside of you.

Jesus' Best Gift for Hard Times

"I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don't be troubled or afraid."

{ John 14:27 }

hen Jesus was close to leaving His disciples, He promised them a gift: peace.
But after Jesus made this promise, a lot of "un-peaceful" things happened. The disciples were scattered, and Jesus died and was buried. How could the disciples not be troubled or afraid when their friend was being crucified? Why would Jesus ask them not to be?

I think it's because He *knew* the situation wouldn't be easy. It is easier to choose and experience peace when things are going great. But when things are difficult and confusing, peace seems harder. Jesus knew that the disciples would need the only thing that could keep them from being troubled or afraid: peace of mind and heart.

Peace allows us to stand firm even when situations are hard. And it is a gift that the world didn't give us, so the world can't take it away. So, when you're going through confusing or difficult times, remember the gift of peace is God's to give. It is for your feelings and thoughts, and it is forever yours.

ACTION POINT: Talk to your mom about past situations where you didn't feel peace. Then talk about if there are present situations where you need peace. Pray together that God will give you His gift of peace.

here I was, holding my new viola on the first day of orchestra practice. I was so nervous! How would I hold the bow?!? What if I dropped it?!? All sorts of thoughts were going through my mind.

When my teacher walked in, she sensed how nervous we orchestra members were. She began to calm us by taking us step by step through what to expect as we learned our instruments. ne of my teachers once told me the true story of a businessman on the morning of 9/11. He had a meeting at the World Trade Center on that unforgettable day. He woke up earlier than usual and chose his best outfit. But as he walked to work, his shoe broke. He was extremely mad, not just because of his expensive shoes, but because he would arrive late for this important meeting. He headed to the closest shoe store. After buying new shoes, he realized how very late he was. As he walked as fast as possible, he saw an airplane crashing into the building where he would have been for his meeting.

Imagine how he must've felt at that moment! See, what he didn't know was that God was saving his life. God still knew this man had a purpose here and did what was best for him.

What about you? How do you react when things don't go the way you planned? When you know your God, you can have peace trusting that He knows what's best for you! It's not about the what but the Who!

ACTION POINT: Write a note thanking God for how He has saved you from things you don't even know about. Remind yourself to have peace when things don't go your way because they're still going God's way - which is the best way.


So, let me ask again: did you obey today?

ACTION POINT: What is your favorite Christmas carol? Mine is "Go Tell It on the Mountain." Find a Christmas carol that talks about Jesus being the Prince of Peace and sing it at your party.

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cardiolo-What?

Though good advice lies deep within the heart, a person with understanding will draw it out.
{ Proverbs 20:5 }



hen we adopted our daughter, Eve, from China, we knew she had a problem with her physical heart. We didn't know if it was a simple or more serious problem. And there was only one way to find out: We had to take her to a cardiologist. That's what you call a heart doctor.

The cardiologist used different machines and tools to hear and see Eve's heart. After lots of tests, the doctor told us the problem in her heart was a small thing, not a big thing. What a relief! But we wouldn't have known that if we hadn't taken her to someone who had a gift for looking at hearts.

Sometimes it's hard to know what's going on inside of us. It can be helpful to talk to someone who knows more about that kind of thing than we do. It's like today's verse says, counselors, mentors, and wise people can help us draw out (or find) the understanding we need.

ACTION POINT: If you're overwhelmed by your big feelings and need peace, talk to your mom. Ask her if she thinks you need a little extra help figuring out what to do with those feelings and pray together about that.

lt. Is Well

I have told you all this so that you may have peace in Me. Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart, because I have overcome the world. { John 16:33 }

hen I was little, my grandmother and I would sing a hymn called, "It Is Well With My Soul." If I felt down, that song would always make me feel better. And a few days before my grandmother died, I sang the song to her. It starts like this:

"When peace like a river attendeth my way When sorrows like sea billows roll Whatever my lot. Thou hast taught me to say It is well, it is well with my soul."

Fancy words, right? The writer of this hymn, Horatio Spafford, was saying that no matter what, even if he's really sad or upset, he is at peace because God is with him. See, Horatio had experienced a terrible loss. His children passed away in an accident, and then the Lord led him to write this song.

When someone we love is sick or passes away, sometimes we struggle to understand it. But, God's Word tells us His peace exceeds our understanding. Exceeds means "greater than." God's peace is greater than what we know. Even when we don't have all the answers, God will still give us peace.

Mary ACTION POINT: Have your mom help you look up the hymn, "It is Well With My Soul," and sing it together. Then, talk about the areas where you need God's peace to be greater than what you understand.

ave you heard the saying, "Keep calm and carry on"? Where I live, I've not only heard it, but I have seen many versions of it. "Keep calm and sparkle." "Keep calm and read books." "Keep calm and be 100% fabulous." and "Keep calm and eat cake" (which is my favorite).

So how do we "keep calm" when things can get a little crazy? Or when we worry or get scared? Or when we are upset or friends hurt our feelings? God says that He leaves His peace with us. So if we have Jesus in our hearts and He is the boss of our lives, He says He can give us peace NO. MATTER. WHAT. Peace is when we know God is right by our side always. Pretty comforting, right?

Psalm 139 talks about how God goes before us, is behind us, is next to us, and is within us. There is nowhere we can go to escape His presence. And it's not in a creepy way. We WANT Him to be with us always. He knows us better than anyone, even ourselves, and chooses to be with us.

ACTION POINT: Find a place where it's quiet and there are no distractions. Close your eyes and picture Jesus in the room with you. What does He want to say to you? Talk to Him. He is listening.

Your Peace Prescription

But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things! { Galatians 5:22-23 }

K, let's pretend you are at your doctor's office. You have a rash you can't stop itching, a headache that won't stop throbbing, and a mind that won't sleep at night. He thinks for a minute and then writes a prescription. It reads:

Medication: PFACE

Dosage: Take every second of every day for the rest of your life. Possible Side Effects: No more worry.

Peace is a cure for worry. Galatians 5 tells us that the Holy Spirit of God produces it in you. You cannot make yourself peaceful no matter how many bubble baths or foot rubs you get! Lasting peace comes from God. It's not something we can figure out or completely understand, but it's there for us always—if we choose to take it.

How do you take it? You pray instead of worrying. Think of God as your Great Physician to cure whatever ails you. Tell Him what your symptoms are. Your visit with God might sound like this: "Dear God, today I need help with my math test. Math is really hard for me, and I am worried that I won't get a good grade. Please help me. In Jesus' Name, Amen!"

ACTION POINT: Grab your prayer diary and write out a "visit" with your Great Physician. Tell Him what you're worried about, and let Him produce peace in your heart.

here was a girl in school who was three years older than me and always found a way to bully me. All of my friends were afraid of her and didn't try to stop her or say anything. I felt so alone.

Have you ever felt that way? We live in a world full of mean girls, bullies, and friends who let us down. Is it possible to find peace in such a world? Absolutely.

Although we often try to find peace and comfort in all sorts of things—friends, family, sports, technology, food, or popularity—there is only one sure thing that will give us the kind of peace we need. Our relationship with God. The peace that He promises us is ours even in our darkest, most anxious moments. He never leaves us nor forsakes us (Deuteronomy 31:6), and He doesn't want us to live with anxiety. stress, and worry. Even when we face mean girls or friends who disappoint us, God's peace will protect us and keep us strong in Him.

Mary ACTION POINT: Write what you are worried or anxious about in your journal. Then create a list of things you are thankful for to replace those worries and anxieties.

Around midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening. Suddenly, there was a massive earthquake, and the prison was shaken to its foundations. All the doors immediately flew open, and the chains of every prisoner fell off!

{ Acts 16:25–26 }

hew! Today's verses just dumped you in the middle of a pretty intense scene, didn't they? If you're like me, you're probably a little annoyed about the cliffhanger there at the end. What happens next?? Does everyone escape and make it out of prison? Speaking of prison, why were Paul and Silas there in the first place? And they were...singing? A lot is going on here.

You can check out the whole story in Acts 16 if you want to know what landed them in jail, but we're going to focus on the part that happens in the middle of the chaos. While Paul and Silas were in prison, they were calm, cool, and collected. They knew that this situation was much bigger than they were. They trusted God's plan and remained calm despite a pretty scary experience!

In fact (spoiler alert), they knew that God put them there to share the Gospel with the prison guard. So when their chains fell off, they didn't coordinate a big jailbreak. Instead, they kept everyone there so the guard wouldn't be punished. Then, they told him about Jesus, and his whole family was saved!

ACTION POINT: Create a playlist of worship songs that bring you peace during tough times. Ask your mom to add a few songs, too! Listen to it when you feel yourself getting anxious or scared.

The Horizontal Peace Challenge

Live in harmony with each other. Don't be too proud to enjoy the company of ordinary people. And don't think you know it all! Never pay back evil with more evil. Do things in such a way that everyone can see you are honorable. Do all that you can to live in peace with everyone. { Romans 12:16-18 }

oday's verse talks about being at peace with those around us. It's saying that we need to do everything we can to fix our relationships with others. We call this "horizontal" peace. We want to make sure that after our relationship with God is whole (which we call "vertical" peace) that our relationships with others are whole too.

So you're probably wondering what the Horizontal Peace Challenge is. That's a great question. It is the discipline or habit of asking ourselves if we are at peace with those around us. It is an ongoing or never-ending task that we have to do as we live life in community with others.

Maybe making peace means asking for forgiveness or forgiving one of your siblings or friends. Perhaps being at peace looks like having a conversation with your mom or dad about a situation. Whatever it means for you, make sure you do what you can to be at peace in that relationship. And do you want to know what the best part is? After you do what you can, the rest of it is up to God.

Mark ACTION POINT: It's your turn to put this challenge into action. Ask yourself: Is there anyone who I'm angry with? Do I need to ask someone for forgiveness? Write down a plan on how you can make peace with them.

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Peace in the Unknown

used to be afraid of sleeping in the dark. I would always have music playing in the background and a light on. I did that for years! Until one day, my mentor told me that one of the first things that happened to her when she came to know Christ was being able to sleep with her lights off. It made me think that I could do the same. I then stumbled on Psalm 4:8. I started asking God to give me peace to sleep in the dark.

The first night I tried, it was so difficult. My heart was racing, and I couldn't fall asleep. I sang and prayed. I moved around and ended up turning the light on. It took time, but I could finally sleep with the lights off. It was a trust exercise for me!

Turning the lights off might seem silly, but it helped me trust God more. The darkness at night resembles the unknown and things I can't control. Resting in the unknown can only come from having peace that God is always in control—even when I can't see. In His arms, I am always safe.

ACTION POINT: What is one area in your life where it is hard for you to have peace in God? Pray and ask Him to give you His peace in that area.

ave you ever noticed a lion's teeth? They have massive canines that grow almost three inches long! I'm grateful that my encounters with these giant cats at nature preserves aren't up-close and personal.

Daniel wasn't so lucky. Daniel 6 says he spent a night in a lion's den while in Babylonian captivity. A rule was created saying people could only pray to the king. But Daniel trusted the one true God and kept praying to Him. He was thrown in the lion's den as punishment.

Yet. Daniel didn't seem afraid. It's because he trusted God and knew he'd done the right thing in still praying to Him. ne summer, I went to Florida with my family to visit my aunt and cousins. It was so much fun! We swam, caught lizards, and did lots of other cool things.

My cousin and I decided to prank the neighbor next door one night. We got a carton of eggs out of the fridge and threw them at his house. They landed on the roof, sides, and then a window! I instantly knew we'd chosen the wrong thing to do.

Before I knew it, the neighbor was pounding on our front door. My dad opened it and was confused about why the neighbor was so angry. After he heard what we'd done, he offered to have the eggs cleaned off the roof and other areas of the house. He also had us apologize to the neighbor. He made peace with the person we had offended.

This verse reminds us that Jesus made peace with God on our behalf. Our sin offends God and separates us from Him. But through Jesus' sacrifice, we're redeemed to a peaceful relationship with God. When God looks at us as followers of Jesus, He doesn't see our sin. He sees His Son.

ACTION POINT: Have you been brought into a peaceful relationship with God by accepting Jesus as your savior? If you haven't, talk to your mom or a trusted adult to see if it's the right time to accept Jesus as your savior.

lease don't send me back," cried Preena, a seven-yearold girl who'd fled the Hindu temple. She'd be beaten or perhaps killed if she was taken back there, where she served as a *Devadasi*. Girls as young as five worked as slaves for Hindu gods.

Keeping Preena meant Amy Carmichael could be charged with kidnapping and sentenced to prison. But how could she turn her away? Maybe this was why God had led her to India in the first place.

Amy had every reason to never leave Ireland. A debilitating battle with pain sometimes caused her to collapse. It took weeks in bed to recover when it happened. But God had called her to be a missionary.

The wind blew Amy to India, where her health would benefit from sunshine. She became one of the world's first women to rescue girls from slavery. She became Amma, or mother, to hundreds of Indian girls during her fifty-three years in India. Amy faced her suffering like Jesus faced His. So, I can imitate her because she imitated Jesus.

There are lots of people who are worldly influencers. But I want to encourage you to follow worthy imitators of Jesus. I hope you will!

ACTION POINT: Do you have a favorite missionary that you like to read about? Talk to your mom about that person. Discuss how they imitate Jesus in the way they live.

ave you ever spent enough time around someone that suddenly you notice you've started talking like them? I have. When I made a new friend from Texas, "you all" became "ya'll." After our family hosted a British soccer coach for the summer, "soccer" became "football."

My mom was always the first to notice when someone else rubbed off on me. Sometimes she would encourage me to spend less time with certain friends if she saw the habits I was imitating weren't good. It was so *frustrating* to me, but looking back, I'm thankful!

The people we spend time with can influence us to be better or worse. Sometimes it's easy to spot a bad influence. Maybe you have a friend with a hot temper like the person in Proverbs 22, and you know not to spend too much time with them. Other times, you might need someone wiser to help you identify a friend who isn't good for you.

Guess what? Your mom or another role model in your life has been your age before and understands the friendship challenges you're facing. Talk to them about your friends and ask if they see any that you shouldn't be imitating.

ACTION POINT: Challenge your mom or role model to an imitation game like HORSE (at the basketball court) or Simon Says! After you play, ask for her advice about which friends are a positive influence.

ne summer, I was waiting for a package with some cool pieces for my turtle tank to arrive. I kept an eye on the front door around noon each day. That's when the packages usually came. One day, I saw the delivery guy jogging to the door with a box I knew had to be for me. I was so excited!

once became good friends with a girl who was a couple of years older than me. I felt so special hanging out with someone older and cooler than me. So I ignored that she constantly encouraged me to do things I didn't feel right about.

As he reached the door, I watched him toss my package onto the porch with a loud thud. When I went outside to grab it, I noticed that the sides were torn and raggedy! What kind of service was this?!

My desire to please her was so strong that I went along with her. I knew that my choices were not right and could have terrible consequences, but I ignored my conscience and my mom's wise warnings. It took a few years and some bad decisions for me to break off this unhealthy friendship.

When I opened the package, most of my items were fine, but the delivery had upset me. It distracted me from appreciating the things I was once so excited about receiving.

God placed wise people in my life—like my parents and another friend—who warned me about being too influenced by this friend. But for a long time, I did my best to ignore them and do my own thing. I wish I had listened to them sooner, but I am glad that I learned that recognizing and staying away from danger is much better than suffering the consequences.

The same can be true when we share Jesus with others. If our delivery is rough and unkind, we can discourage people from receiving the truth we're sharing. We have to be loving and patient rather than argumentative and forceful.

ACTION POINT: Are you blindly choosing what feels good and hoping for the best, or are you making wise choices based on what God says? Ask God for wisdom in choosing friends and for godly influences to speak into your life.

As followers of Jesus, we aren't called to win arguments. We're called to love people well. When we lovingly deliver truth, we represent God better and more fully.

So I urge you to imitate me. { | Corinthians 4:16 }

o you listen to how your mom or dad speaks to others or watch how they act when they're frustrated or sad? I observed my mom and dad a lot. As I watched them, I wanted to do things I saw them doing. I listened to how they talked to each other and their friends. I watched when they were happy, sorrowful, or angry. What I noticed the most was how they treated each other and those around them. But what I didn't realize was how much they influenced me and how I imitated them.

Just like my mom and dad influenced me, the Bible reminds us that as we follow lesus, we can influence others through our words and actions. In today's verse, the Apostle Paul tells his readers to imitate him just as he imitates Christ.

Even if we don't realize it, others are watching us. Our siblings, friends, and classmates observe what we say and how we act. We need to show compassion and concern, letting others know that we really care about them instead of focusing on ourselves. When we listen and show interest in their problems, we're demonstrating to them the love of God.

Maction Point: Be a good example of a person whose life has been transformed. Seek to influence others and point them to Jesus. Write a list in your journal of how you can influence others by your actions or words.

want to be a hero. I want to save the day, stop the villain, and rescue those in peril. But most days, I can barely find my sneakers, much less a hero's cape.

As it turns out, cape owning and building leaping are not hero requirements. The Bible says a woman who is known for other things like being a good mom, taking care of strangers, and helping those in trouble is the kind of woman who deserves respect.

Consider the Wesley brothers, John and Charles, who were great preachers and hymn writers. Where did their love for Christ come from?

Enter the undercover hero of this story—their momma! She may not have worn a cape, but Susanna Wesley is certainly a hero. Susanna depended on Jesus. She took responsibility for her children's souls. When she needed time alone with God, Susanna sometimes pulled her apron up over her head—a clear cue to her children to leave their mom alone. Susanna wasn't hiding under her smock for "me time" but to pray for herself and her family.

If you ask me, those prayers worked. (And I guess she kinda had a cape after all!)

ACTION POINT: Is your mom respected for the good things she does? Is she doing a good job raising you? If so, you might be living with a 1 Timothy 5:10 hero! Write her a note telling her that you respect her!

s nervous students stepped off buses at summer camp, my job was to check in the girls. Each camper picked up her room key, t-shirt, and Bible. Next, they wrote their names on sticker tags after the pre-printed words, "Hello, I am..."
That's when it happened. One camper's name tag read: "Hello, I am...
PEER PRESSURE!"

From the beginning of camp, she decided not to be *influenced BY* bad examples but to follow "what is good." As a *Christ-influencer OF* her peers, she embraced the truth that influence is part of our God-given identity! It's who I AM. It's who YOU ARE!

With Jesus as your #1 Influencer, you can live as a godly "True Girl" influence for others *not to sin*, rather than being pressured by peers *to sin*. And you know what? Most of your peers want to do what's good and God-honoring. They just need a positive influencer like you to follow!

ACTION POINT: Read Ephesians 4:14-15 and make your own name tag that reads, "Hello, I am Godly Peer Pressure." Put it on your mirror, dresser, or your bedside table. Then, step out as a confident influencer.

ave you ever run a race before? It can be pretty exhilarating! In a race, one key thing that a runner needs is *focus*. Focus helps them stay in the zone and keep their mind on the finish line. Mental training can be as important as physical training, especially for a long race. You don't often see marathon runners get distracted when they run past a Dunkin' Donuts, do you?

In Galatians 5:7–8, Paul wonders what influence has negatively impacted the Christians in Galatia—a church that had previously been following Jesus so closely! He noticed they had taken their eyes off the freedom God had called them to and challenged them to examine who they were listening to and believing instead.

We hear a lot of distracting voices each day. They may come from our friends, teachers, or the movies we watch. The list is nearly endless. Did you know that you see over 550 advertising messages each day? That's about one EVERY MINUTE. But it is possible to keep focused on following the truth! You might just need a little more mental training (which comes from things like reading these devos or using your memory verse cards).

ACTION POINT: What, if anything, is holding you back from following the truth? Spend some time praying, journaling, or talking to your mom about what you can do to reduce the influence so you can keep your eye on the finish line!

ave you ever been hurt by your friends' words about you? Have you ever questioned whether or not the bad things they say about you are true? Because I have!

I was pretty seriously bullied by a few girls who were once my friends. At one point, almost every person I went to school with believed the lies about me. I felt so alone. One day, I was eating dinner with my mom and talking to her about how I didn't want to go to school anymore. She looked at me and said, "Abby, are the things they are saying true?" I looked at her confused and said, "No, of course not." She put her fork down and said, "The lies they make up about you say a lot more about them than they do about you."

{ John 13:14 }

ave you ever washed someone's feet? It's kinda gross—especially if the feet are dirty, smelly, or sweaty. The practice of foot washing was originally an act of hospitality in Middle Eastern homes, performed for guests by a servant or the wife of the host. But, in John 13, we see Jesus washing His disciples' feet.

You'd think the disciples would have washed Jesus' feet. After all, Jesus was the leader. But, instead, Jesus modeled a new way of leadership. He led humbly and selflessly. He could've commanded His disciples to serve Him, but instead He served them.

Next time you are put in charge as the leader, how can you be a servant leader? Instead of using it as opportunity to boss people around or make them serve you, serve with them to accomplish your goals.

ACTION POINT: How can you be a servant leader? How about washing your parents' feet? Or planning a service project? Make a list of ideas and put one into action this week.

henever the prophet Jonah's mentioned, so is a great fish. It's not every day a man becomes fish food and lives to tell about it. But did you know that Jonah's story starts with him running away from God?

God had instructed Jonah to deliver bad news to the evil city of Nineveh. But Jonah didn't want to. So he took a boat in the opposite direction.

Yet God didn't let Jonah off the hook. Cue a storm, a man overboard, and a great fish. The result? The runaway prophet ended up in Nineveh. Jonah's words influenced the people to repent, and God showed them mercy. But Jonah didn't think they deserved God's mercy.

Perhaps there's someone you know who doesn't seem deserving of God's kindness. Jonah's story reminds us that God has enough mercy for everyone. If we listen when God says go, we can influence others to receive it.

ACTION POINT: Read the book of Jonah. Draw a timeline of his story. Start with God asking him to go to Nineveh and end with Jonah and the withered plant. Be sure to include the storm, big fish, and people repenting.




Don't Follow the Money

t was happening again. I was in class, and the same girl was whispering and glancing at me with a smirk. One friend suggested I confront her in front of everyone. Make a big deal and embarrass her so she'd never bother me again.

Ms. Layne seems to have trusted in her money. Lots of people do. Some people believe if they have a lot of money, nothing can harm them. They surround themselves with stuff, and that's where their security is.

But a friend from youth group suggested something different. She encouraged me to talk to her. She thought that maybe we'd had miscommunication that we needed to work through. I decided to give her suggestion a shot.

Money's a necessary thing. It's important to work hard and make sure your needs are provided for. Money isn't bad. Loving and trusting money is the danger. The Bible talks about that very problem. "For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil. And some people, craving money, have wandered from the true faith and pierced themselves with many sorrows" (1 Timothy 6:10).

The next day, I had a conversation with that girl, and miscommunication was the cause of our problem. Can you imagine if I'd taken my other friend's advice?

The love of money will tempt people away from their faith in God. When money becomes a person's passion, they become willing to do anything to get it, and they always want more.

Taking advice from the right people is important. Their suggestions can either help our situation or make it worse. One way to find out if you're listening to the right person is to check and see where their advice is coming from. Is it someone who doesn't know Jesus and is trying to guide you based on their desires and feelings? Or is it coming from someone who IS following Jesus and led by His desires and feelings? If you have the right source, the right advice won't be far behind.

When you select people to be like, make sure they use money to love and serve God rather than loving the money itself.

ACTION POINT: Use your journal to answer: Am I a friend who gives godly advice? Do I have friends who give godly advice? Next, ask God to help you both give and receive advice that has Him as its source.

ACTION POINT: We show we have a proper view of money by using it for God's kingdom. Could you use some of yours to help someone or donate to a Christian ministry? It reminds you money is for serving and loving God!

ave you ever believed that you need to reach a certain age to make an impact? Sometimes it's easy to think, "I'm too young to be an example to others." But that's not true! You can influence those around you no matter what age you are!

nfluence, now that's a big word! Did you know that influence means you can affect someone else's character, development, or behavior? Say what?! That's right. So how do you influence someone? One way is through your words.

The Bible tells us in 1 Timothy 4:12 not to think less of ourselves because we're young. Paul was telling Timothy this because Timothy had great responsibility at a young age. Paul didn't want Timothy to doubt himself because he was young. Instead, Paul tells Timothy to be an example to all believers in how he speaks, lives, loves, and in his faith and purity.

Scientific studies tell us that girls have twice as many words to say as boys do daily. That means we need to be careful what comes out of our mouths since we have a lot to say! It's easy to speak words that can hurt others and damage the way people who don't know Jesus view how Christians should treat them. One piece of advice: Before you say anything, ask yourself, "If Jesus was sitting next to me, would I say what I'm about to say?" If the answer is no, then you shouldn't say it. Because the truth is that Jesus IS with you through the Holy Spirit.

So whether you're seven or twelve, or somewhere in-between, you can influence others today! You don't have to be older to have an impact. All you have to do is live according to what the Word of God tells you. Don't ever underestimate yourself. Live like Christ, and others will see Him through you!

You have the opportunity to encourage, inspire, and bring a smile to someone's face by what you say to them. And your words will have a lot of influence in drawing others to Jesus as you show His love to them!

ACTION POINT: Who could you influence right now? What will you do so they can see Christ through you? Pray about it and ask God to show you what He wants you to do and how!

ACTION POINT: Ask God to place someone in your heart who needs a little encouragement. Write them a letter and let them know how special they are, a great quality you see in them. or how you are praying for them.

Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before Him He endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

{ Hebrews 12:1-2 }

he bookshelves in my home are lined with biographies.I have always treasured the stories of faithful Bible teachers and missionaries like George Müller, Hudson Taylor, Gladys Aylward, and many more.

Though many of my favorite biographies contain stories of men and women God used to do extraordinary things, most of the subjects were ordinary people—you might even call them unremarkable. (That means they were not particularly interesting or exciting.) But these people trusted in an extraordinary God and He used them in extraordinary ways.

Hebrews 11 gives snapshots of many of the heroes of our faith, whose lives should challenge us. But turn the page to Hebrews 12, and your focus shifts away from stories of individuals and toward the God who writes every story. That chapter tells us to look to Jesus, who is the pioneer and perfecter of our faith.

Learn from people whose lives say, "It's about Jesus." They are worthy influencers.

ACTION POINT: In Hebrews 11, you'll find names of heroes of the faith that God wanted us to remember. Circle the name of someone familiar to you and talk to your mom about what you can learn from that person's life.

ave you ever heard the story of Job? He was going THROUGH IT. Every bad thing you can imagine happened to him, and he tried his best to stay faithful to God in the middle of it. One day, his friends showed up to be with him and help. Great news, right?!

Well...it was for about a week. They sat with him in silence and comforted him. But after that, they decided it was time for tough love. They thought they could influence Job by giving long speeches about why they thought bad things were happening and how Job could fix them. Unfortunately, this wasn't helpful. Their words were so hurtful that in Job 16:2, he called his friends "miserable comforters." Ouch!

Can you relate? Maybe you've been in Job's shoes, and your friends weren't encouraging to you during a difficult time. Or maybe, if you're being honest, you've been more like Job's friends and instantly gone into fixer mode instead of just being a listening ear. Either way, there's a lesson to learn from Job's reply. Sometimes being a good friend looks like being there when things get tough and providing words of encouragement.

ACTION POINT: Do you know anyone who is going through a tough time right now? Think of a few ways you can be an encouraging influence (writing a letter, bringing them dinner) and ask your mom for help to make it happen!

As much as the nutrition experts tell us to cut back on salt, God says, "More salt!" Jesus told His disciples they were salt. How? Well, here are three ways a Christian can be salty:

- Salt brings out the flavor of food. A Christian's positive influence helps others see the true flavor of God's love. She helps others get a taste of the truth of Jesus.
- Salt tenderizes. When I have a relationship with someone who doesn't know Christ, and I love them, that makes their heart more tender to receive God's truth.
- Salt preserves. Part of our job as Christians is to help God's Word get planted into others' lives. If a person hears the truth but doesn't have anyone to help them understand and live it, the truth can get stale in their lives.

Get out there and spread the salt around, so you don't lose your saltiness. Salt doesn't do any good if it just sits in the shaker.






Apples Are Good Teachers

Some people make cutting remarks, but the words of the wise bring healing. { Proverbs 12:18 }



If I had taken the rotten apple out of the basket, it wouldn't have messed up the good one. And that's what Proverbs 1:10 tells us about our hearts. We need to be careful about who we spend time with! When our hearts are influenced by those who choose to sin intentionally, our hearts are like those apples.
