et's make it a year where you learn to pray God's Word. How? You take a Bible verse and rewrite or speak it as a prayer! For example, if I wanted to pray Matthew 7:24–26, I could say:

ave you ever done or seen a trust fall? My son and daughter did one at school the other day. They stood up on a ladder, and a bunch of their friends stood behind them with their arms in a specific pattern that was perfect for catching my kids.

My son crossed his arms, made his body straight, and confidently fell backward into the arms of his friends. My daughter, however, wasn't so sure. It was harder for her to let go of the ladder. It was harder for her to trust that her friends would catch her. (Being up on a ladder is scary for some of us, isn't it?)

In the book of Luke, when the angel told Mary she was going to have baby Jesus, it was like a trust fall for her. She decided to trust that God keeps His promises, and she would serve Him no matter what.

ACTION POINT: Take today's verse and turn it into a prayer for yourself. You could say something like. "God, I want to serve You. I trust that everything You have planned for me will happen as I obey You. Amen."

ear God, um, I don't really know how to, like, pray for this thing, so I guess, just, you know, do something. Like, change stuff and make it better and . . . and . . . um, Amen, I think."

Have you ever prayed like this before? Sometimes when we have something big to pray about, our words get jumbled up. I used to get that way, but not anymore because I've learned about a secret weapon God's given us. Well, it's not really a secret, but it's so amazing and powerful! It's like finding a buried treasure! Here it is: I can take Bible verses and turn them into prayers—and so can you!

The Bible is one of the greatest weapons we have. Today's verse even tells us the Bible is a sword! The book of Hebrews says that God's Word can show us what to do in tough situations. # Asking in His Will

This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us.

And if we know that He hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of Him.

{ 1 John 5:14–15 NIV }



e all have ideas of what we think is "good" in situations. But we make judgments and God, decisions with limited information. Our all-knowing however, sees and knows everything! The One who made us ALWAYS knows what's best. That's why we pray according to HIS will, not our own

God answers our prayers in many ways. Sometimes He says "wait," and other times He says "no," but the answer is always for our good and His glory (Romans 8:28). If a response to a prayer is "no," try not to be discouraged. Even Jesus received a "no" response from God. In Luke 22:42, Jesus prayed before He went to the cross, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done."

Jesus didn't want to suffer, but ultimately He surrendered what He wanted to what God wanted. And aren't we grateful that He did that?! Now, we get to be a part of God's family forever!

ACTION POINT: Talk with God about His will for your life and dig into His Word. Pray for insight. Ask Him to make your heart want what His heart wants. He will show you how.

# The Right-Now Prayer



The king asked, "Well, how can I help you?"
With a prayer to heaven, I replied . . .
{ Nehemiah 2:4-5 }



o you know what a cupbearer in the 4th century B.C. did? His job was to taste-test all of the king's drinks to make sure they weren't poisoned.

Nehemiah, who was a captive in Babylon during this time, served as a cupbearer to King Artaxerxes.

One day, the king noticed that Nehemiah looked sad. He'd never seen his cupbearer unhappy before. So, the king asked Nehemiah why and what he could do for him. Before Nehemiah answered the king, he stopped stopped and prayed first.

Like Nehemiah, sometimes you might be in a situation where you have to reply quickly. Even if there's no time to think about your answer first, Nehemiah's story shows you there's always time to pray.

What should you pray for? We don't know what Nehemiah said to God, but James 1:5 tells us that when we ask God for wisdom, He gives it to us. So, the next time you need to give a right-away answer, stop and pray a right-now prayer for wisdom!

ACTION POINT: Do you know why Nehemiah was sad? Read Nehemiah 1 and 2. You'll learn why he was so unhappey and what he ended up asking the king to do for him.

ACTION POINT: Is there a situation in your life that you think Jesus couldn't possibly understand or relate to? Use your journal to tell Him about it and ask for help believing that He does understand.

rayer is such a powerful tool God has given His followers. It allows us to talk directly to our Father about anything and everything. But if I'm honest, sometimes I don't use that tool well. hen my pastor would say the word "everything" in one of his sermons, he'd always ask the congregation, "What's included in everything?"

hen I was I I years old, I wanted to go to camp for a week. However, I knew my parents would probably say "no" because it cost a lot of money. I felt my request was too big for them to say "yes" to, so I didn't ask for days. Finally, I found the courage to ask, and they said, "YES!"

Sometimes, we can think our requests are too big for God. Just as I thought my parents would say "no" to me, we believe God will say "no" to our prayers before we even ask Him. But in today's verse, Peter took a HUGE request before God. He asked God to bring a woman back to life! Peter had to trust that God would answer this big prayer, even if God's answer was to say "no."

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# Are You Listening?

And Samuel replied, "Speak, your servant is listening."

{ 1 Samuel 3:10 }

efore Samuel became Israel's first prophet, he was a little boy living in the temple. You might know the story of his mother, Hannah. She asked God for a baby for years. Samuel was the answer to her prayers. When he was old enough, Hannah brought him to serve God alongside a priest named Eli.

"Samuel grew up in the presence of the LORD" (I Samuel 2:21), but back then, "messages from the LORD were very rare" (I Samuel 3:1). So, one night, when Samuel heard someone calling his name, it never occurred to him that it was God. But it was! Samuel finally responded with, "Speak, your servant is listening," and God gave him his first of many messages.

Prayer isn't just about talking to God. It's also about listening to Him. He may not call your name out loud as He did for Samuel, but God does speak to you through His Word. So, the next time you read your Bible, start by praying, "Speak, your servant is listening," and see what God wants to say!

ACTION POINT: Read all of 1 Samuel 3. Create a comic strip of Samuel's middle-of-the-night conversation with God.

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# Remember What He Did Through Prayer

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He said, "Praise the name of God forever and ever, for he has all wisdom and power." { Daniel 2:20 }

ne of the most important lessons I have learned so far happened when I was around eight. I'd just heard the story of Daniel and the lion's den. You would think I came away considering how brave Daniel was and how I should be that way too! But that wasn't what stood out to me. The part of Daniel's story that captured my attention was when Daniel remembered to thank God for what He had done in the past and how He had answered Daniel's prayers.

When we pray, we should come to the Father, offer requests, and talk about our fears and concerns. But through Daniel's story, God's Word also reminds us that our faith grows when we look back and consider how God has answered our prayers because He loves us.

ACTION POINT: Draw a tree with bare branches. Whenever you think of something to thank God for, write it on a leaf and put it on the tree. Over time, you will see how your faith grows like a well-nourished tree.

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# Spiritual Superfood

hese verses claim that rain and snow make the farmer's crops grow. Of course, we realize it takes moisture to make seeds sprout and crops grow, so the rain makes perfect sense. But how does the snow help?

Well, snow helps to keep the ground moist through the winter, but there's also something we cannot see happening. Snow contains small amounts of nitrogen, a super food for certain plants that grow in Northern regions. In other words, it's God's way of sending fertilizer for the crop that hasn't even been planted yet.

The words in your Bible are like that. They prepare you for things yet to come. Maybe a job God has for you in the future. Or a friend you'll help through a hard time. Or a disappointment that you'll need strength to work through. God's Truth contains superfood for your heart.

ACTION POINT: Use the words of Isaiah 55:10-11 to write or speak a prayer to God. Ask Him to make your soul soak up the words in your Bible the way the ground soaks up rain or snow.

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### Your Will. Not Mine

"Father, if you are willing, please take this cup of suffering away from me.

Yet I want your will to be done, not mine."

{ Luke 22:42 }



efore Jesus was crucified, He said, "Father, if you are willing, please take this cup of suffering away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine" (Luke 22:42). Jesus knew that He had come to be a sacrifice for our sins. So why was He asking God to take the suffering away from Him? Because He was also 100% human. Jesus knows what it is like to be scared. He felt everything that we have felt. But despite His fear, He prayed that God's will would prevail.

I've learned to pray like this too, but it still scares me. Deep down, I want MY will to be done. I want God to answer my prayers how I think is best. However, I've learned His ways are better than mine.

You can start praying for God's will too. When you do, you're saying, "Lord, I want this, but I trust that You love me and know what's best for me. So, I'm deciding to trust Your will."

ACTION POINT: Is there an area in your life where you've refused God's will because you think yours is better? Write it down and ask God to give you peace and power to release it to Him.

undreds of years ago, seals were used on most documents to close them and prove that the document really was from the person who sent it. Most seals had a picture of the owner and a motto (or saying) around the edge.

However, a Great Seal or Royal Seal was special. It belonged to the monarch (a fancy name for a king), and all important business the monarch did had a Great Seal attached. If a document had this seal, it had the monarch's "seal of approval," meaning it contained the monarch's wishes or commands. It gave the document authority and power.

When Peter and John prayed for the man in the verse above, they did it under Jesus' Royal Seal—His name. That means when we pray, we can do so under the authority and power of our King of Kings, Jesus.

Let's ask God for His power in our prayers by praying them in Jesus' mighty name!

ACTION POINT: As you pray to day, remember to use your God-given authority. Seal your prayer "in Jesus' name"!

# A Power-Packed Prayer Tutor

I praise you, O LORD; teach me your decrees.

hen my three-year-old twin granddaughters met their new cousin, they were so excited. "Hi, Stella!" They said it over and over again. But Stella was foneweek old. She didn't say anything back. Eventually, Zoe said sadly, "Stella doesn't want to talk to us!" As children, we cannot learn to speak unless we are taught.

That's how prayer works, too. We learn it best by having someone teach us. And that's important because even when we do not know how to pray, we're told to "pray without ceasing" (I Thessalonians 5:17).

Thankfully, God has provided a tutor. That's where Scripture comes in. There are lots of prayers in the Bible that show us how to pray. The Psalms are a particularly good prayer tutor. As an early church father and theologian once said, "the other Scriptures speak to us, but the Psalms speak for us."

If you're unsure how to pray, open your Bible to a Psalm. You'll find lots of verses to pray out loud.

ACTION POINT: Use Psalm 119:12-14 above to pray. Just read it as it is or change it a little bit to sound more like the way you talk.

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# Love Like A Valentine

So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other.

Just as I have loved you, you should love each other.

Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples."

{ John 13:34–35 }

Valentine's Day was not originally about buying cards for friends. The first Valentine's Day feast remembered the sacrifice of Saint Valentine, who was killed for standing up for Jesus.

And that's exactly the kind of love Jesus told us to have for one another.

The night before Jesus was crucified, He was at a special feast with His disciples. One of them, Judas, had to leave early. Why? To tell the enemies of Jesus where the Savior could be found so they could get lesus, take Him to prison, and kill Him.

Jesus knew all of this. Right after His betrayer left, Jesus said: love each other. And He says it's a new commandment. But it's not entirely a new idea because the Old Testament instructed God's people to love their neighbor.

So, what's new? We're supposed to love like Jesus. That means we love people even when they hurt us, and we love them until it hurts us — just like Jesus.

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom to help you google Saint Valentine.

Read about the first Valentine's Day feast together.

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### Let's Talk About It

Teach them to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up.

{ Deuteronomy 11:19 }



oday's verse urges people to talk about God's work in their lives. God had brought the Israelites out of Egypt and performed miracles to keep them safe. He parted the Red Sea so they could escape from their enemies. He provided food for them in the desert. He even showed them the way to go by appearing as a cloud during the day and fire at night.

God's people got married and had babies. Those babies did not get to see all the wonderful things God had done. But what good does a story do before someone experiences God for themselves? I think that our stories are SO important!

I remember hearing Dannah Gresh's story for the first time. She talked about her struggle with sin and how God forgave her. I kept that story hidden in my heart and remembered it years later when I had my own sin to confess. When I ran to Jesus, He was the one who set me free — but Dannah's story reminded me that He could.

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom or another grown-up to share one special way they have seen God work. Then, think about how YOU have seen God work.

Share your story with someone and celebrate God's goodness!

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### Love Prospers

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Love prospers when a fault is forgiven, but dwelling on it separates close friends. {Proverbs 17:9}

n 7th grade, my best friend pranked me in front of a classmate. I was sad and embarrassed! When my other classmates found out, they got mad and said things to make her feel bad. I had to decide whether to join them or forgive her.

She apologized and explained that she didn't mean to harm me. She was just trying to be funny. Even though I still felt bad, I forgave her and defended her in front of my classmates. She was still my best friend, and I loved her. I didn't want one mistake to separate us, so I let love prosper, just like Proverbs 17:9 tells us to do.

When I forgave my friend, I also had to decide not to keep thinking or talking about what happened. Sometimes we say we forgive someone, but we keep reminding them of what they did wrong. But that isn't how we develop good friendships. When God forgives our sins, He forgets them, and we should do the same with those around us.

ACTION POINT: Is there a friend in your life that you haven't forgiven? If so, choose to forgive them. Then, write them an encouraging letter and share something they're good at.

ho do you call in an emergency? We are taught to call 911. This puts us in touch with first responders like the police, fire department, and an ambulance to come to the rescue. Our first responders bring us comfort and help in times of need.

Did you know God has His own 911 direct line? Psalm 91 is God's first response in times of need. He sends immediate help to remind you of His love, provision, and strength.

You can pray this beautiful psalm when you feel afraid during an emergency. When you pray Psalm 91, you will experience peace, knowing He is protecting you during scary times. And, if you know someone who is feeling anxious in the middle of an emergency, you can pray this psalm for them too. God's 911 will remind you and others how close God really is.

ACTION POINT: Make cookies, write thank you cards, and deliver the goodies to a first responder in your area. Pray Psalm 91 for your evening prayer.

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# Growing Closer to the Best Advice

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Plans succeed through good counsel; don't go to war without wise advice. { Proverbs 20:18}

hen you spend a lot of time with someone, you grow closer to them. You listen, see how they act, and sometimes, complete their sentences. My daughter,

Zoey, and her newly acquired bestie in fifth grade grew very close. But one day at recess, Zoey noticed her bestie being unkind to others. This pattern continued, and Zoey became disappointed in her friend's actions. She came to me for advice. Zoey wanted to be there for her friend but knew this friend's actions were not honoring God. Over time, they drifted apart.

Have you ever had a friend you were once close to but aren't anymore? Did you ever ask anyone for advice on this friendship? God wants you to ask wise, godly people for advice. But even more, He wants you to ask Him. The closer you get to the Lord, the more you'll know what He wants you to do, and His advice is always the best.

ACTION POINT: Re-read Provertes 20:18. Ask a firusfied friend or adult for advice this week on a problem you have. Then spend time with God, growing closer to Him and asking Him for wisdom.

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## Jesus Wants to be Your Friend

Come close to God and God will come close to you. { James 4:8a }



magine there's a new girl in your class. She is friendly to everyone! You want to be her friend, but you decide not to talk to her. Then, at recess, she offers to teach everyone how to jump double dutch! She invites you to join, but even though you want to, you head for the swings by yourself.

Wait a minute! You wanted to be her friend, but you wouldn't talk to her or join in to jump rope! Why would you do that?

Maybe you wouldn't act like that toward a new classmate, but I think sometimes we act like that toward Jesus. Did you know that Jesus wants to be your friend? In James 4:8, He is inviting you to come close. He wants you to talk to Him and spend time with Him. He wants to teach you how to live for Him. ACTION POINT: What are some characteristics of Jesus that you can imitate? Read Galatians 5:22-23 if you need help thinking of some.

ven though you love Jesus, you can feel tempted to lie, be lazy, not eat well, be mean, and do all kinds of other things. And, while it's true that Jesus didn't have to decide what movie to stream, He did have to decide what He put into His mind.

Our focus verse today refers to Jesus as our High Priest. That basically means He's the number one authority when it comes to how we live our Christian lives. And Scripture tells us that even though Jesus is the High Priest, He was still tempted and tested just like we are! But He didn't sin in the middle of all of it.

Knowing that Jesus understands what we're going through helps us know we can talk to Him about absolutely anything. And when we do that, it opens the door for an even deeper relationship with Him.

ACTION POINT: : Is there something you've been ashamed to talk about with God? Today, take some time to share it with Him. Tell Him you're thankful that He understands how you're tempted and ask for His help to overcome it.

# Check Your Roots



Look after each other so that none of you fails to receive the grace of God.

Watch out that no poisonous root of bitterness

grows up to trouble you, corrupting many.

{ Hebrews 12:15}

efore I became a Christian, I was lonely. I had no one to run to when I was sad or in trouble. But after I came to Christ, God gave me a faith family. People started praying over me, asking me how I was doing, and keeping me accountable in the areas where I was weak. I was truly surprised. I didn't know a community like that existed!

Hebrews 12:15 encourages us to look after each other so that none of us "fails to receive the grace of God." It also tells us to watch out "that no poisonous root of bitterness grows up to trouble us." What does that mean? ACTION POINT: Write an appreciation note to at least five people from your community. Encourage them to alo the same for other people! Let's lift each other up!

"But among you it will be different.

Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first among you must be the slave of everyone else."

{ Mark 10:43-44 }



ave you ever given any of your friends a nickname?
Jesus did! He called His friends James and John "Sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17). These brothers, who were His first two disciples, were known for being bold and aggressive.

So, it's no surprise these two men weren't shy about asking Jesus for a favor. "When you sit on your glorious throne," they asked. "We want to sit in places of honor next to you, one on your right hand and the other on your left" (Mark 10:37).

Today's verse is how Jesus replied, and I bet it wasn't the answer James and John expected! Jesus said that if they wanted to lead, they needed to serve. Now, if these brothers had stopped to think about Jesus' example before asking, they might have realized Jesus daily modeled serving others over being honored.

One of the best ways we can become more like Jesus AND love others is to serve. And, if you're wondering, the "Sons of Thunder" did choose servanthood rather than importance!

ACTION POINT: Are you a leader at school, church, or home? Think about whether you serve others in this role or want to be served. Ask God to help you choose service over honor.


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#### SOS



o those dots and dashes mean anything to you? If you've grown up in a sailing family, you might recognize that as Morse code for "SOS." Morse code is a method of communicating using rhythm. You tap out letters and numbers until you have a message. SOS is a message people send out when they are in trouble and need help.

Peter sent out a major SOS while he was walking on the water toward Jesus. Jesus told him that he didn't need to be afraid. Peter did well for a bit, but then he got terrified. He called out to Jesus, "SOS!"

I really love that God's Word says Jesus "immediately" reached out and rescued Peter. I can just picture Jesus holding onto him, saying, "I'm right here, and I love you more than you'll ever know."

God wants to rescue you, too! Talk to the Lord every day about anything and everything. Let your faith grow so that in times of trouble, you can be sure He hears your SOS.

### Yes. Your Honor!

Love each other with genuine affection, and take delight in honoring each other. {Romans 12:10}



ou might have heard the words "Yes, Your Honor" in a TV show or movie you have watched. Or maybe, you are an amazing adopted daughter who remembers your mom and dad saying, "Yes, Your Honor," to the judge in the courtroom on the day of your adoption. Saying "Your Honor" is like telling the judge, "I respect you. I think highly of you."

God says that we should love each other "with genuine affection and delight in honoring each other" (Romans 12:10). The word *genuine* means true and real. We need to be true and real in our love for each other and always treat other people highly.

I remember saying, "Yes, Your Honor," on our children's adoption day as my husband and I promised the judge that we would genuinely love and respect these kids. We were also saying that, no matter what, we would think of them more highly than ourselves.

ACTION POINT: The next time you have difficulty loving and honoring someone, pretend they are a judge. Maybe even picture them wearing a judge's robe. Practice seeing of hers more highly than yourself, and it will help you to genuinely love of hers.

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## Nice and Cozy

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But as for me, how good it is to be near God!

I have made the Sovereign LORD my shelter,

looovveee being near my mom. When I was younger, I lay close to her and talked her ear off. Thank God she was a patient woman! And honestly, that hasn't changed now that I'm an adult. I still curl up near her and let the words flow.

I like being close to my mom because of how she impacts me. I feel peaceful with her and know she sees and hears me no matter how much I talk. She provides a sense of calm and safety that makes everything feel alright.

Being near God is a bit like this but times a billion. While my parents are an example of God's love and protection for me, the peace and comfort He provides are infinitely more than they could ever offer in their humanity. He's my protector who hears me whenever I call and shelters me in His love every moment of the day. I read and pray regularly as a way to curl up next to Him and have a sweet conversation.

ACTION POINT: Curl up next to God today! Find a quiet and comfortable place and bring your favorite pillow and blanket. Spend some time talking to God. Tell Him everything and know that He loves listening to you.

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#### The Jesus Follower Who Failed

Then Jesus told him, "Follow me." { John 21:19 }



ave you ever done something you're ashamed of or wished you could undo? Jesus' friend Peter did! Peter was usually a bold and fearless man, but after Jesus' arrest, he got scared. He was so afraid that he told people he didn't know Jesus. Crazy, right!?! Afterward, Peter was so upset at himself that he "wept bitterly" (Luke 22:62).

But Peter's failure didn't make Jesus give up on him. Three years earlier, Jesus had told Peter, "Come, follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people!" (Matthew 4:19). And, after Jesus came back to life and He saw Peter again, He told Peter the same thing, "Follow me" (John 21:19).

As you keep growing in your relationship with Jesus, you'll sometimes fail too. You might worry that Jesus will give up on you when you do. But He won't. Like Peter, Jesus will keep saying to you, "Follow me." And, as you keep following, you'll continue growing to be more like Him.

ACTION POINT: Read the story of Jesus' breakfast on the beach with His clisciples in John 21. Put yourself in Peter's shoes and write a journal entity about how he may have felt.

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## What Is God's Love Like?



How precious is your unfailing love, O God!

All humanity finds shelter
in the shadow of your wings.

{ Psalm 36:7}

ave you ever seen a photo of a chicken with her babies hiding under her wings? Mother hens watch for danger. When they see an animal that could hurt their chicks, they cluck softly to warn the babies. The baby chicks quickly run under their mother's wings for safety. The mother hens keep their chicks under their wings until the danger has passed.

That's the way God describes His love for you.

In one place, the Bible talks about the mother bird's wings, specifically pinion feathers. These are the ones that are soft, and we make pillows out of them. The pinion feathers have down on them, which is super soft and cozy.

God is a safe place that is soft and cozy for you. And when you run to Him to be safe, you'll find that His protection never fails. The trouble may still come. But you'll ultimately feel His love and protection more than you do the hard things that happen.

So what is making you feel afraid? Run to Him!

MacTION POINT: Is there something bothering you right now? Do you feel unsafe? Write a prayer to God asking Him for help.

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# Prepared for Growth

All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work. {2 Timothy 3:16–17}



s a teenager, I quickly learned the importance of preparation. Actually, I learned the 5 P's—Proper Preparation Prevents Poor Performance. Wouldn't you agree that things typically run a bit more smoothly when we are prepared? For example, properly studying for a test often leads to passing the test. And properly training for a sport helps you win the match. Well, just as we should learn how to prepare for tests and sports, we should also learn how to prepare for life and growth as Christians.

One way to prepare and grow as a Christian is by studying Scripture. The Bible is God's Word. Through it, He prepares us for life as believers. God's Word helps us to grow and mature. Therefore, it is very important that we diligently study Scripture whenever we can. When we do, it is like studying before the test or showing up at the gym before game day. It's preparation! And if we want to grow in Christ, we must prepare by digging into God's Word daily.

ACTION POINT: Are you prepared for growilh? Block outtime on your calendar to study God's Word daily. It also might be helpful to find a "Growilh Partiner" who is willing to study Scripture with you and help you stay on track.

If someone claims,"I know God," but doesn't obey God's commandments, that person is a liar and is not living in the truth. But those who obey God's word truly show how completely they love him. That is how we know we are living in him.
{ 1 John 2:4–5 }

y three-year-old granddaughter Addie loves to run from me when I try to catch her. This is OK if we play a game, but it is very very unsafe when I call her to come to me. There are a lot of reasons why I call her. Maybe I see a car coming. Or I don't want her to get lost. I tell her to come to me because I love her.

The Bible says that someone who loves God obeys Him. But someone who does not obey Him is a liar.

I don't like that Bible verse very much, but it is true. God does not want us to live life in dangerous ways. So, He has created some rules, called commandments, to keep us safe. When we lie or cheat or are jealous of other people, we do not obey His rules. And we are not responding to Him in love.

ACTION POINT: Are there some areas where you are not obeying God? Talk to your mom about it. Ask her for help to respond to God's commands in love by obeying Him.

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# Forgive as You Have Been Forgiven

Be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you. { Ephesians 4:32 ESV }



y mom couldn't attend my high school graduation.
She was going through a hard time and seeking help at a Christian retreat. I was sad and angry because I wanted her there on my important day. But she left me a note apologizing and promising that she would be at my college graduation.

When my college graduation came, I remembered that my mom wasn't at my high school graduation. The day before I graduated, I asked God to heal my wounded heart. I also decided to forgive my mom and be grateful that she was at my college graduation.

Forgiving is hard to do. The longer we take to forgive, the more power we think we have. But unforgiveness can lead to the emotional pain of anger, hate, hurt, resentment, and bitterness and can even cause health issues. There's a reason why the Bible keeps reminding us to forgive others in verses like today's passage!

There's so much peace in knowing that our loving heavenly Father forgives our sins. How about we start loving that we GET to forgive other people as well?!

ACTION POINT: Write down Ephesians 4:32 and place it somewhere you can see it daily. Meditate on it and share it with someone who might struggle with unforgiveness. We're all in this together!

have a horrible sense of direction. Sometimes I get lost going to my own house from work My mother-in-law, however, is great with directions. She can even use

It simply withers and dies, proving no longer good for anything. And the same is true for us. We cannot grow in Christ if we are separated from Him. We must remain in Him!

ACTION POINT: Don't hink of Bible study and prayer as things to check off your list. Think of them as ways to bear fruit! The more you do them, the closer you grow to Jesus.
