Hey Mom!

This letter is for you, I promise. But I needed to share a bit about myself in order to communicate this months lesson. So...stick with me! It'll all make this months lesson. So...stick with me! It'll all make sense in a minute.

I just got off the phone with my mom because I needed her help with this letter.

"Creative, withdrawn, sensitive, compassionate, uninhibited, loving, and trusting."

These are the adjectives she used to describe me during my tween years.

It was interesting to hear her use those particular words because that's pretty much what I remember about myself during those years, too. I remember being very sensitive and easily absorbing the words and emotions of others. I remember my brother and sister referring to me as "Spacey Staci" because I was always lost in creative thought. And I remember my mom regularly reminding me that I couldn't do too much at one time even though I wanted to do it all.

My memories of my childhood confirm every adjective she used to a tee. My mom knows me and she knows me well. The same is true about my father.

My parents were careful to study me as I grew and because they did, they were able to recognize my natural bent and encourage me down that path. They saw my creativity and love for music and got me viola lessons. That investment eventually led to me playing it for God's glory at True Girl live events twelve years later.

I say all of this to remind you that knowing your daughter's individual bent is crucial to her development and life's calling. God tells us the same in His Word.

Proverbs 22:6 says,

Train up a child in the way he should 90; even when he is old he will not depart from it.

The Hebrew word for "way" in this verse is derek. Literally, it means "my way" or "bent." You'll hear this verse unpacked much more in this month's Momcast episode but the easy Truth to grasp right now is that studying your daughter and recognizing her giftings and talents is an important step in training her to live for the Lord. Seeing you put this into practice for her life can also teach your daughter to look for God's bent in others so she can love them well and encourage them down the path God has for their lives too!

This month, we want to enroll you in a new area of study in the school of life: Your daughter 101. Take some time to recognize the unique ways God has crafted her. Notice her interests, methods of communication, and the situations and activities that seem most natural for her. While you won't get a grade at the end of this course, the rewards are greater than you could ever imagine.
