ne time I asked my mom why fireflies light up. She said that they talk to each other through their glow. I thought it was so cool they could communicate like that! Elisha picked up Elijah's cloak, which had fallen when he was taken up. Then Elisha returned to the bank of the Jordan River. { 2 Kings 2:13 }

ou might wonder, "What does today's Scripture verse have to do with Glow and Tell?" I'm glad you asked! Elijah was a mighty man of God who provided many powerful miracles through the strength of the Lord.

Elisha stuck by Elijah's side. (Did you catch how their names in English are almost exactly the same?) Elisha wanted to learn from Elijah and serve the Lord in the same powerful ways.

One day, the two men were walking along and suddenly a chariot of fire appeared, and a whirlwind took Elijah to heaven! AMAZING! Elisha saw it all happen, and when he noticed Elijah's cloak on the ground, he took it as his own. It was a symbol of Elijah's legacy being passed on to Elisha.

Did you know that's what Jesus-loving mamas do? They want to pass on their love for God to their girls so they can do great things for Him, too! That's powerful!

ACTION POINT: Sit and think for a few minutes about how your mom passes on what she knows about the Lord and the Bible to you. Thank God for it.

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'Grandma's Favorite Memory

But the Lord said to her, "My dear Martha, you are worried and upset over all these details! There is only one thing worth being concerned about. Mary has discovered it, and it will not be taken away from her." {Luke 10:41-42}

o you know anyone who has Alzheimer's? It's a disease that affects people's minds and memories. My grandma had it and slowly forgot who we were.

But one thing Grandma never failed to remember was her love for her Savior. She kept reading her Bible and singing her favorite hymns. As her memories faded, her relationship with Jesus kept growing.

Jesus' friends, Mary and Martha, had different ideas of what it meant to love Him. Martha served Him in practical ways, while Mary chose to spend time with Him. In today's verse, Jesus isn't telling Martha that serving doesn't matter. It does! But He IS saying that the relationship we build with Him is what lasts forever.

Both my grandma's and Mary's examples inspire me! Like them, I want to remember "the one thing worth being concerned about" (Luke 10:42)—growing in my relationship with Jesus!

ACTION POINT: Read Today's verses in Their full context in Luke 10:38-42. Then, learn more about Jesus' friendskip with Mary and Martha and how He raised Their brother from the dead by reading John 11:1-44.

When someone first gives their heart to Jesus, they probably aren't ready to dive right into the "meaty" things of the faith. It is wise for a "baby believer" to learn about prayer and studying the Bible.

ACTION POINT: Make it a goal to grow up in your faith and become a "meat eater." Learn something new about your faith today. Ask your mom or dad to help you learn a big word about your Christianity.

h, glorious spring break! Don't you love it? A few years ago, I watched my daughters jump on their new trampoline and cringed with every jump. Would they rocket off to a rooftop somewhere? Would they hit the side of the house? Would they fall off and break . . . everything!?!

riving at night is hard! I remember one of the first times that I pulled out of the driveway in the dark. I could barely see a thing and couldn't figure out why it was so hard to see. Mary Magdalene found the disciples and told them, "I have seen the Lord!" Then she gave them his message. { John 20:18 }

ave you read the book *Little Women*? It's the tale of the four March sisters—Meg, Jo, Beth, and Amy. I'm the oldest of four girls and a mom to four "little women."

So, I love stories with four sisters!

But what does *Little Women* have to do with today's verse? Whenever I read John 20, I remind my "little women" that the first person Jesus appeared to after His resurrection was a woman. Her name was Mary, and Jesus told her, ". . . go find my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God'" (John 20:17). Jesus could have talked to His other friends Himself, but instead He allowed Mary to share the good news!

ACTION POINT: Read John 20:1-18 and learn the full story of Mary meeting the resurrected Jesus. Use the events of the passage to create a fun comic strip that you can show your mom and share with friends!

Tell your children about it in the years to come, and let your children tell their children. Pass the story down from generation to generation. { Joel 1:3 }

ne of my favorite days in elementary school was field day. I enjoyed the friendly competitions between the other classes. The activity I signed up for each year was the relay race. We had to run around the track and hand off the baton to a teammate.

This verse makes me think of those field days. But instead of the friendly competition, I think about passing the baton of faith to the next generation. The next generation means people who are born after you. How do we do that? By modeling our faith to those around us.

The next generation—or those younger than you—should be more powerful and stronger because of hearing about God's goodness, power, and mercy. They need us to tell and show them. As you are running the race, make sure you are passing something to your teammate that will be helpful AND eternal.

What are you passing on to the next generation?

ACTION POINT: Do you see God at work in your life? Make a list of Things you can start doing to be intentional about sharing your faith. If you have a hard time thinking of things, ask God to give you wisdom.

an you remember the last time you told someone your God story? Do your friends know how you came to accept Jesus as your Savior? How often do you tell people about God's faithfulness in your life? Just like the generations before you should pass on their God stories, you should too.

I'm sure your mom and others (like your grandma or aunts) can't wait to hear about some of your favorite things, what you love about your family, and what God may be teaching you right now. The Bible says there's no greater joy than hearing that our children are following the truth.

Yep, you have a testimony! It's time for you to tell your story—to your family, friends, and anyone who will listen! Not only will it bring your family great joy, but your Father in heaven will love to hear you sharing your story, too.

ACTION POINT: Find today's verse in your Bible and circle the word "Truth." Talk to your mom about how following God's Truth has changed your life. I'm sure you two will have quite the joyful time together!

ave you ever had something so wonderful happen to you that you just could NOT keep it to yourself? Maybe you got a new puppy, aced your math test, or scored the winning goal at your last soccer game. ave you ever felt like people weren't listening to you because of your age? I know I have. I'm the youngest sibling in my family, so I often would have to go along with what the older kids wanted to do. Sometimes they didn't think what I wanted to do was as important as what they wanted.

It doesn't feel good when you don't think you're being valued. That's why I love today's verse. The Apostle Paul is telling young Timothy not to let people look down on him because of his age. He told Timothy that he was supposed to be an example to other believers.

As you share your testimony, you are an example to others, no matter what age you are. God makes it very clear that being young does not make you any less important than anyone else. Others will follow you as you live for Christ and tell them about Him.

ACTION POINT: Are there people you've wanted to tell about Jesus but were afraid they'd think you were too young? Let 1 Timothy 4:12 give you the courage to share your God story with them.

Remember your leaders who taught you the word of God. Think of all the good that has come from their lives, and follow the example of their faith. { Hebrews 13:7 }

hen my dad was in Bible college, I listened to him practice the sermons he wrote for class. But I didn't stop there! I also memorized what I heard him say and later taught it to my little sister and stuffed animals.

I think of my dad *and* mom when I read today's verse. In it, the writer of Hebrews encourages readers to "remember your leaders who taught you the word of God. Think of all the good that has come from their lives, and follow the example of their faith" (Hebrews 13:7).

My parents taught me to read, listen to, and love Scripture. But they didn't stop there! In their attitudes and actions, I watched them faithfully live out the instructions and wisdom of God's Word. ACTION POINT: Does Hebrews 13:7 bring to mind any leaders in your life? Make a list of the good in their lives and share it with them. Encourage them with how Their example of faith has impacted you.

Now that I am old and gray, do not abandon me, O God. Let me proclaim your power to this new generation, your mighty miracles to all who come after me. { Psalm 71:18 }

ur family friend Pam was a treasure. She is someone I am honored to have had in my life. Something I will never forget about Pam is her love for the Lord. She was constantly talking to my girls about Jesus! She desired to invest in them because—just like you—they are the new generation that God is raising up! ave you been redeemed? To *redeem* something means to buy it back. It means to rescue! Everyone in this world was, at some point, a slave. But

instead of being owned by another person, they were owned by sin. They were stuck living in disobedience to God and were separated from Him.

But God loved you and me so much that He decided to redeem us from slavery to sin. He sent His Son Jesus to die in our place and pay for our sins with His own life. Not only did He die for us, but He was raised back to life so we can live with Him forever.

Take a look at our verse for today. If you have been redeemed, tell someone about it! And if you haven't, talk to your mom, dad, or an adult in your life and ask them how you can be redeemed.

ACTION POINT: This may feel silly, but I want you to go outside and shout, "I am redeemed!" Say it multiple times! Then, think of someone you can tell about it. Ask them if they want God to redeem them too!

Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path. {Psalm 119:105}

y roommate Liza is studying to be a pilot! One time, she shared with me the difficulties of flying at night. Can you imagine being in charge of a giant plane full of people and trying to land it safely in the dark?

Thankfully, pilots have lots of lights to help them! At airports, hundreds of lights line the runway. White, green, and red. Flashing and normal. Tall and short. Every light has a job. Each light communicates something to the pilot, who relies on that information.

We're like those lights! However, our light can communicate different things. When we show God's love to other people, we are shining for Him. But we have a different light when we are angry or upset, and that light might not communicate kind things to others. So, let's always check our light to make sure we are shining for God and not for ourselves.

ACTION POINT: What do you think your light is communicating? Pray and ask God to help you see what your light is telling other people. Are you glowing for Him?

Sometimes doing the right thing is the hardest choice. I knew the right thing to do was to let my sister wear my new dress. So why was it so hard to give in?

The Bible tells us that none of us are born without sin. It is no surprise that we do the wrong things, even though we know what is right. But, as today's verse says, there is a blessing for us when we obey what God tells us to do. And sometimes this victory in Christ looks like letting our little sister wear our brand-new, favorite dress!

ACTION POINT: The next time someone asks you for something that you have a firm grip on, ask yourself. "How would Christ handle this situation?" Then respond how you think Jesus would.

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loyal Responsibility

But you are not like that, for you are a chosen people. You are royal priests, a holy nation, God's very own possession. As a result, you can show others the goodness of God, for he called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light. { 1 Peter 2:9 }

ou are chosen! God chose you to be His precious daughter. And He is the King of the universe so, that would make you . . . a princess!

Take a second and read our key verse for today. You are chosen, royal, holy, and God's very own possession. But being a chosen daughter of the King doesn't come without some royal responsibilities. (*Responsibilities* are stuff we need to do!)

As the daughter of the King, God wants you to tell others how good He is and be a light in the darkness of this world. How do you do that? Well, as we've been talking about this month, you can be a light in this world by "glowing" and "telling." You can glow by doing your best to become more like Jesus each day and loving others as He would. Then you can tell by sharing with others what Jesus has done for you!

Are you up for this royal task?

ACTION POINT: Think of one good thing God has done for you. Maybe He answered a prayer or gave you a beautiful day to enjoy. Perhaps it is that God has forgiven your sins! Whatever it is, tell someone about it!

How Dirty Counters

You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everyone. { 2 Corinthians 3:2 NIV }

It was late, and I was working at my first job. I was tired and wanted to go home, but I noticed some dirty counters that needed wiping. I knew the Lord wanted me to clean

them instead of walking away and leaving them for someone else.

As I wiped them, a coworker told me to leave them dirty because I was delaying others from clocking out. I didn't know how to respond.

"You leave her alone," another coworker said. "Something is different about that girl." I was shocked by her words.

I didn't do anything special. I was wiping dirty counters others ignored. But because of that, someone noticed something different about me.

We have opportunities all around us to show we are different because of Jesus. Everyday tasks can be a testimony to others that allows us to tell them about the salvation God offers to all.

ACTION POINT: People are watching you. Today, embrace opportunities (no matter how small they seem) to point others to the goodness of God.

Be Prepared

Preach the word of God. Be prepared, whether the time is favorable or not. Patiently correct, rebuke, and encourage your people with good teaching. { 2 Timothy 4:2 }

ne summer, I was struggling to share God's truth with a close friend of mine. She was living in a way that was not glorifying God and would ultimately hurt her and

those around her. After praying about it, I decided to talk to her.

I explained to my friend that following the Lord's commands would bless her more than living for the world. As much as I would like to say this fixed everything, my friend still decided to live her way instead of God's way. Even though I am no longer close to her, I know that I made the right decision in sharing the truth of Jesus.

Second Timothy reminds us, "Be prepared." As believers in Christ, we must not shy away from the truth that God has given us. We prepare to share it by reading the Word of God and spending time with Him.

ACTION POINT: As you read the Bible this month, take notes on what stands out to you. Perhaps God will have you share what you read with someone else.

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Share Your Jesus Story

But how can they call on him to save them unless they believe in him? And how can they believe in him if they have never heard about him? And how can they hear about him unless someone tells them? {Romans 10:14}

Id you know everyone who follows Jesus has a Jesus Story? It is the story of how they came to believe in Jesus and made Him King of their heart. Did you know that your

Jesus Story can be a powerful tool to help others come to know Jesus too?

Romans 10:14 tells us that our actions alone are not enough to tell someone about Jesus. We need to use our words! For people to believe in Jesus, they need to hear about Him. And, for people to hear about Jesus, it is up to you and me to tell people about Him!

How did you come to believe in Jesus? Who told you that Jesus died for you, raised to life on the third day, and wants you to live for Him? Share that story with someone who doesn't know Jesus today. You might just help them have a Jesus Story of their own!

ACTION POINT: Write out your Jesus Story and share it with someone. Write about what you were like before you knew Jesus. who told you about Him. and what changed after you believed in Him.

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First-Century Family Tre

. . . and Mary was the mother of Jesus who is called the Messiah. { Matthew 1:16 }

ave you sat down and read Jesus' family history? It's recorded in the first chapter of Matthew. There are some names in it that I can't pronounce, like Amminadab and Jehoiachin! But four other names make me smile: Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba, and the woman mentioned in today's verse—Mary.

These are all women in Jesus' family tree. What's interesting is that the book of Matthew was written in the first century when society didn't value women as much as men. So why does Matthew mention these mothers?

The main reason is that all Scripture is "God-breathed" (2 Timothy 3:16, NIV). The Holy Spirit inspired Matthew to include these women. God wanted their names, stories, and faithfulness to Him remembered. But I'd also guess it's because Matthew hung out with Jesus—and Jesus values women! Matthew watched Jesus love, invite, rescue, and honor females. Jesus went against the culture, and Matthew did too!

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom about your family free. See if there are any stories that she can tell you about a woman of God in your family history.

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Crowned with Glory

Then God said, "Let us make human beings in our image, to be like us. They will reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, the livestock, all the wild animals on the earth, and the small animals that scurry along the ground. " So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. {Genesis 1:26–27}

> fter God created the world, He made two more things! A man. And a woman. Adam and Eve were the first humans.

God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit had a conversation and decided to make them "in the image of God." That means humans are like God in special ways. Nothing else God made is quite as important because of this stamp of God's image we carry. One Bible verse (that we'll look at tomorrow) says humans are "crowned" with glory. God's glory.

Because we are made so unique, we can glorify God. We can point to Him and remind people about Him.

Many things about us are like God, but in this verse, only two things are mentioned: maleness and femaleness. There's something pretty special about being a girl (or being a boy) that helps us remind people that we are created in God's image.

ACTION POINT: Celebrate being a girl today. Write "It's great to be a girl!" somewhere special. Maybe the inside of your Bible or on a sticky note you put on your bedroom wall!

Crushing Unworthiness

When I look at the night sky and see the work of your fingers the moon and the stars you set in place what are mere mortals that you should think about them, human beings that you should care for them? Yet you made them only a little lower than God and crowned them with glory and honor. {Psalm 8:3–5}

ircle the word "glory" in the verses above! Today I want you to remember that you carry the glory of God all over you and in you. (Read yesterday's devo if that doesn't make any sense to you!)

Even so, I bet you've had no-good, very-bad days when you feel awful about yourself. (I had a whole bunch of them late last year. I was just sad and felt insecure in a lot of ways.) We all have days like that!

I hope you're not having one like that today, but if you are, remember that God thinks you're incredibly valuable! In fact, He made you just a little less important than Himself. You have great worth because God says you do.

Think about that and be set free from any insecurity you may be having!

ACTION POINT: Use the words of Psalm 8:3-5 to write a prayer. Just use what's there as a guide. I'll get you started: "Dear God. Sometimes I look at the sky and remember that your fingers made those stars and that moon!" (Keep going!)

You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother's womb. { Psalm 139:13 }

am not good at crafts. When I was twelve, I sewed a shirt in a home economics class. It was so small that it didn't even fit over my head. But my daughter Lucy is really good at

crafts. She knits the cutest hats!

She's made a navy-blue beanie for Grandpa and a burgundy one for her aunt. Lucy takes her time, carefully counting the stitches to follow a pattern.

The Bible says that you were knit together in your mother's womb. Now that's much more complicated than Lucy's hats! God had a design for exactly how tall you would be, the color of your hair, your personality, and so much more. You are not an accident. You are designed by God, and every cell in your body has a purpose.

Remember today that you are wonderfully made. You have been perfectly crafted by a loving and creative God!

ACTION POINT: When you look in the mirror, smile and remember God made you. You are a work of art! If you don't feel good about yourself, say out loud, "God knit me together in my mother's womb. He doesn't make mistakes."

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Majestic You

For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago. { Ephesians 2:10 }

y favorite discovery on a trip to Colorado was how beautiful the mountains were both far away and up close. I saw the towering peaks covered in pine trees and fog from a distance. And, when I studied the closer details, I saw the little things that made the mountains unique, like the bubbling freshwater springs and delicate wildflowers. God designed every little nook and cranny of the mountains to bring Him glory.

God made you the same way. He designed every part of you and chose the key traits of your identity. All of you brings glory back to Him.

The world wants you to change who you are and how you act to be beautiful, but that's not God's plan for you. As today's verse says, you are His masterpiece! You are His beautiful, chosen daughter. He loves you just as you are.

ACTION POINT: Go on a walk and take pictures of some beautiful things in nature. Maybe it is a pretty flower, a unique leaf, or even a little critter? Remember that the same God who made those beautiful things made you?

who Knows if Perhaps..

"If you keep quiet at a time like this, deliverance and relief for the Jews will arise from some other place, but you and your relatives will die. Who knows if perhaps you were made queen for just such a time as this?" { Esther 4:14 }



f you read the book of Esther in the Bible, you will see Esther's a total rockstar. Not the "screaming into a microphone" kind of rockstar, but a crazy for God kind

of rockstar!

She went from being an orphan raised by her uncle to marrying the king and becoming a QUEEN! The problem was the Jewish people, her people, were in great danger, and she had to make a choice: Stay safe and keep quiet or speak up and use her position to try and save many people.

Her uncle looked at her and said, "Who knows if perhaps you were made queen for just such a time as this?" And Queen Esther decided that she had been created to be a mighty woman of God and would not stay silent—no matter what happened.

Queen Esther's actions saved an entire nation! She was born at just the right time . . . and so were you!

ACTION POINT: You can decide, like Queen Esther, to be a mighty girl for God! Take some time and talk to God about that. Tell Him you want to obey Him no matter what, and ask for His strength to do that!

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Ves-ti-gi-uho?

The LORD has made everything for its purpose... { Proverbs 16:4 ESV }

id you know that when a scientist can't find the purpose of something, like the appendix, they call it *vestigial* (pronounced *ves-tih-gee-al*)? That's a mouthful, right?!

And if scientists don't recognize parts of DNA, they call them *junk* segments.

But we now know that the appendix is considered a "safe house" for good bacteria that can help our bodies after a sickness. And "junk" DNA plays a huge role in our genetics.

God made everything for a purpose!

Have you ever wondered why you were created? You were made for a very special purpose—to bring glory to God. That means that everything you do, every talent and gift you have, should be used to honor and praise Him.

So on those days when you're questioning your purpose, or you're not quite sure what you're supposed to do . . . remember that you were made to glorify God. That IS your purpose!

ACTION POINT: Ask your mom to help you look up a picture of an appendix. Can you believe something that size can have such a big purpose? Only God could think of that!

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Just Do It

So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God. {1 Corinthians 10:31 }

y worship leader had just asked me to sing for our upcoming Christmas Eve service. It had been many years since I had sung a solo, and my pride kept me from quickly saying yes.

I thought: What if I mess up and my friends judge me? People will compare me to other better soloists at church! But this thought came too: Nikki, are you going to do this for your glory, or are you going to do this so that the Lord can have the glory?

I knew that if I were to make an excuse not to sing because I was too proud of potentially sounding terrible. I would be doing it because I wanted the glory of sounding amazing. But, if I were to say yes to bringing the Lord glory through the song's words, then it would really be about Him and not me. So, I said yes!

ACTION POINT: The next time you have to choose between doing something that makes you look good or doing what you know will bring the Lord alory, choose Him. You won't rearet it, and the Loral will bless you!

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In the Name of Jesus Christ

Come, let us worship and bow down. Let us kneel before the LORD our maker, for he is our God. { Psalm 95:6–7 }

woman once found an old ring in a drawer she hardly ever used. She said, "O' that old thing! I think I'll get it appraised."

She took it to a jeweler. He examined how the stones' colors, texture, and clarity presented themselves. After several minutes, he recognized it was a style of jewelry art that was no longer done. This was an ancient and priceless piece. It was worth more than any he'd ever had. Shaking, he told the woman, who was astounded.

Imagine, she'd kept this thing in a drawer, not knowing its value. But now, she fell to her knees when she understood what it was worth.

The psalmist asks us to do what the jeweler did. What the woman did. To really experience the value of our God and to worship Him. The word *worship* comes from an Old English word: worthship. It literally means to appraise something and respond to its value.

ACTION POINT: Appraise the worth of God today. What have you seen Him do in your life? Ask your mom how He has shown up in her life. Then, worship Him.

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A New Nature

Put on your new nature, and be renewed as you learn to know your Creator and become like him. { Colossians 3:10 }

ave you ever thought about the fact that you were created to be like your Creator? Colossians 3:10 says that if you believe that Jesus is the Son of God and make Him your Savior, you are a new creation! You are a completely new person inside and out! And because you are a new creation, you also have a new nature that helps you stop disobeying God and start living in a way that brings Him glory.

This verse tells you to put on your new nature like clothes and to be renewed as you learn to know God and be like Him. How do you do those things? By reading God's Word! The Bible teaches about God so that you can know Him better, and it also teaches you how to become more like Him. That's why it is so important for you to make time to read the Bible every day!

ACTION POINT: If you aren't reading the Bible each day. pick a time and start! Maybe you can read in the morning or nght before bed. If you don't know what to read first, try the book of John or Colossians.

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God is Good

ave you ever colored a picture and put it on the fridge or in a picture frame? It's a wonderful feeling to have other people see your hard work. There is a lot of effort that goes into creating something beautiful.

Did you know that you and that picture have a lot in common? Just like you carefully made your picture, God carefully created you. He chose your hair and eye color, height, talents, and everything about you! You are His masterpiece. God created you to show His love, mercy, and glory to the world. How amazing is that? God chose YOU to bring Him praise!

You are God's perfect picture. When life gets tough, remember that you have been hand-painted by the Creator of life. The other things of life will fall into line if you keep Him as your focus.

ACTION POINT: Spend time looking at how uniquely God designed the world. There are so many details! Try to find something beautiful you haven't noticed before-and remember that the God who created that is the same God who designed you!

hat's your favorite kind of fruit? I'd have to go with strawberries! They're so sweet and go perfectly with another one of my favorite foods: chocolate! Did you know that God talks about fruit in the Bible? In John 15:8.

Job you know that God talks about fruit in the Bible? In John 15:8, Jesus tells His followers that when they produce much fruit, they show that they are truly His disciples and bring glory to God!

Now, you may be thinking: What does growing fruit have to do with following Jesus? Well, the fruit that Jesus is talking about here is not the kind you eat. The fruit He is talking about is the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (see Galatians 5:23). These are the kinds of things that God wants to grow in our lives, and He wants us to show that fruit through our actions.

And the very hairs on your head are numbered. { Matthew 10:30 }

was a tall child. Way taller than the other girls my age. So much taller, my ballet teacher moved me to the next level ballet class because I looked so ridiculous in the class of girls my age. There was a small problem, though. I had zero skills in ballet. I remember being confused about a lot of the classes.

As much as I might wish I were a ballerina, that's not how God made me. He didn't give me good handwriting or great math skills. But God made me exactly the way He wanted me to be. He knew exactly what skills, gifts, and talents to give me to do what He called me to do.

The Bible tells us that God knows the number of hairs on our heads. He made you exactly like you are to be exactly who He has called you to be. And He thinks you are amazing!

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Living With Awareness

For as the waters fill the sea, the earth will be filled with an awareness of the glory of the LORD. { Habakkuk 2:14 }

o you live with an awareness of God's glory? Maybe you aren't sure. To be *aware* of it means you live your life always remembering just how powerful and amazing our

God is. So, how can you tell if you're doing that?

When you and I live our lives aware of God's glory, it impacts everything we do!

For example, we will choose not to disrespect our parents with our words because God's Word says to respect them. We will love our siblings instead of fighting with them because it's what God wants us to do. We will treat others better than ourselves (letting them go first in line or picking out the biggest cookie in the cookie jar) because Scripture says we need to put others before ourselves.

So live aware today and seek to give God glory in every moment of your day!

ACTION POINT: How can you choose to do what gives God glory today? If might be tough because, deep down, we want the best for ourselves. Pick one Thing, and if you struggle, don't give up? Ask God to help you.

hen I was in first grade, I won a national poetry contest. I won first place out of more than a thousand entries. Here's the poem that still hangs on my mom's wall:

> The Woodpecker makes his nest in a tree He pecks all day no matter what we say, So I'd better go away Before he pecks me.

How did that win?

The book of Psalms is a whole book of songs and poems inspired by God. What a gift to have 150 to choose from when I'm looking for words to describe how I feel! Every now and then, I'll read a psalm out loud to God as if I wrote it myself because it's exactly what I feel like telling him in that moment. But you can also write your own. Have you ever tried to write your own psalm? You can! Just write down how you feel about God and his love for you. You can make it rhyme or not. It's totally up to you. If you play an instrument you could even set it to music and share it with your family.



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God's Brown-Eyed Girl

You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed. { Psalm 139:16 }

hen Amy Carmichael was a little girl, she asked God to make her brown eyes blue. He didn't. But years later, Amy finally understood why.

She served as a Christian missionary in India for 55 years. In India, most people have brown eyes. So, Amy's eyes made it easier for her to be accepted there. But, even more importantly, her brown eyes helped her rescue children forced to work as slaves in Hindu temples. (Hinduism is the most common religion in India.) Amy often had to disguise herself as a local woman to save the kids, which she wouldn't have been able to do with blue eyes.

Before Amy was born, God had laid out every moment of her life just as today's verse says. And God knew that brown eyes were one physical characteristic that would help Amy bring Him glory! It just took Amy time to realize this too.

ACTION POINT: Like Amy, maybe you've asked God to change your appearance. But what if you changed your prayer instead? Ask Him to use your physical characteristic to bring Him glory-just like He did for Amy.

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Becoming a Protégé

Come, let us tell of the LORD's greatness; let us exalt His name together { Psalm 34:3 }

s a teenager, I helped teach a girl's Bible study group. It's where my love for teaching God's Word exploded! Whenever I taught Scripture aloud to others, it seemed to go deeper into my soul and impact me more.

Psychologists call this the *protégé effect*. There is science behind it, but l'll just give you the basics. When you teach something to others, it sinks deeper into your brain, and you can develop more of a desire to want to learn.

So let me ask: Do you talk about the Lord's greatness and glory with others? Do you share your thoughts and ask questions about God's Word at Bible study, Sunday school, or with a trusted adult?

Don't let fear hold you back from sharing God's glory with others! The effects of sharing aloud will bless both you and others!

ACTION POINT: Grab a group of friends and a trusted adult and start a Bible study. You can share what you are learning about God through time in His Word and ask questions to understand God's glory better.

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Glorify God Together

Bring all who claim me as their God, for I have made them for my glory. It was I who created them. { Isaiah 43:7 }

> id you know that one day Jesus is coming back? The trumpets will soundand and you will see a great warrior king coming on the clouds with His angel armies

behind Him!

Isaiah 43 tells us about that day. He will gather His people from all over the world. People who love Jesus will come together from every corner of the earth to praise Him! Verse 7 of Isaiah 43 tells us that God created us for His glory. You and I have been made to tell God and others how awesome He is!

Many people don't glorify God because they have never heard that Jesus died for them. Our job is to point everyone to Jesus and tell them how awesome He is! Then, if they also decide to follow Jesus, they can join us in praising God so we can glorify Him together.

ACTION POINT: Glorify God by worshipping Him Through music. Listen to The song "Psalm 34 (Taste and See)" by Shane and Shane. Then, ask your mom or dad to help you share this song with a friend who doesn't know Jesus.

ave you ever seen a picture of a silkworm? Before the silkworm turns into a fluffy moth, it is creepy, crawly, and squishy. These creatures make the soft, shiny, strong material called silk. It is used for clothing, furniture, surgical material, and even bike tires!

You might laugh, but sometimes, I feel like a silkworm. I have days when I get tired. My hair gets fuzzy, my makeup smudges, and sometimes I even have on two different socks! However, God sees through it all. He knows what He created me for: to bring Him glory!

Just because you are having a rough day doesn't mean you can't praise God. Even on your worst days, God sees the child He created. He sees your beautiful heart, sunshine smile, and the soul of a daughter who loves Him. You don't need to look perfect to bring glory to God. You do that by being who He made you to be.

ACTION POINT: The nexitime you have a rough day, find one way to bring God glory that day. Maybe it is by encouraging someone, doing an extra chore to help your family, or listening when a friend needs to talk.

n sixth grade, I lived in West Virginia. They call it wild and wonderful for a reason! Almost every morning, I saw turkeys, baby deer, bunnies, and other wild animals in our front yard.

But nothing could beat the sunrises.

One morning, I did not want to go to school. I felt lonely there, and the thought of walking through those halls made me cry. My dad comforted me and said it was time to go. As we pulled out of the driveway, the sun started to rise.

Deep orange and red beams of light lit up the mountains around us. Slowly, the earth began to come alive. "God is giving you a reason to smile with this sunrise," my dad said.

He was right. That sunrise reminded me of God's promise never to leave or forsake me. And this promise is the same for you!

ACTION POINT: God always finds ways to show us His glory and presence, no matter what we are facing. Keep your eyes open today. Look for all the ways that God is revealing Himself to you.

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How to Bring Him Glory

Rather, you must grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. All glory to him, both now and forever! Amen. {2 Peter 3:18}

> aybe at this point in this devotional book, you are thinking: OK, I get it. I need to give God glory in my life. But how do I do that?

Great question! Here is the thing: you will not know how to give God glory if you don't know Him!

When you start a new friendship with someone, you don't really know that person (what they like or what makes them feel loved) until you spend time with them. Our relationship with God works the same way. We cannot know how to give Him glory in our lives if we don't know Him and what brings Him glory.

When we spend time in God's Word, we get to know His heart. He teaches us through His Word how He wants us to live. When we apply what God's Word teaches us to our everyday lives, we are bringing Him glory!

ACTION POINT: How's your time with God? Decide today to spend time every day reading your Bible. Ask God to show you how He wants you to apply it to your life so that you can glorify Him.

Taming the Tongue

But no one can tame the tongue. It is restless and evil, full of deadly poison. Sometimes it praises our Lord and Father, and sometimes it curses those who have been made in the image of God. { James 3:8–9 }

> here is a part of your body that the Bible says is very powerful. Do you know what it is? (Hint: Look at today's key verse!)

It's your tongue! James 3:8–9 tells us that it is very hard to tame or control your tongue. The very same tongue we use to praise God can be used to hurt others. That's why it is so important to use our tongue in a way that glorifies God and shows others how awesome He is!

We were made to glorify God in everything, including our words. One thing that helps me to speak things that glorify God are three questions I try to ask myself before I say something: Is it true? Is it kind? Do I really need to say this?

I may not be perfect, but those three questions have kept me from saying things I would have regretted later. Maybe they can help you too!

ACTION POINT: White down these three questions: Is it in the point is it kind? Do I really need to say this? Put that paper somewhere you will see it every morning. Let it be a reminder to glorify God with your tongue.

Be Like Deborah

Deborah, the wife of Lappidoth, was a prophet who was judging Israel at that time. She would sit under the Palm of Deborah, between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and the Israelites would go to her for judgment. { Judges 4:4–5 }

ave you ever read about Deborah in the Old Testament? Her story is in Judges 4 and 5. Deborah was a judge in Israel. A judge was a leader God gave the job "to rescue the Israelites from their attackers" (Judges 2:16).

Deborah is the only female judge in Scripture. It was unusual for a woman to fill this particular role in that time and culture. Yet, Deborah wasn't afraid or unwilling to be different from the women around her and do what God called her to do—and she brought glory to God by obeying.

We live in a culture that says being a girl means looking and acting in specific ways. Maybe you don't fit that mold. If you're different, there's nothing wrong with you! God created you to be female AND to be uniquely you. So, like Deborah, courageously be the girl God made and obediently do what He calls you to do!

ACTION POINT: Read Judges 4 and 5. Draw a picture of what you think Deborah looked like silling under a free and serving as a judge for Israel.

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his Love—His Glory

Not to us, O LORD, not to us, but to your name goes all the glory for your unfailing love and faithfulness. { Psalm 115:1 }

uring a really hard time, I remember being brave enough to ask a question I was too scared to even think about before: Does God really love me?

Asking that question started me on a journey. It is one thing to ask a question but another to find the answer. I began pouring through Scripture and was blown away by what I saw in God's Word. All over the Bible, I discovered how God deeply loves us despite our flaws. His love is mind-blowing!

When I became more aware of God's love for me and His faithfulness to me, I realized how much God deserves all the glory in my life. How can I not love Him by living in a way that gives Him glory?

When we spend time in Scripture and see how much He loves us, we cannot help but want to glorify Him!

ACTION POINT: Use the concordance in the back of your Bible to look up verses about God's love. Write down three of them to think about this week. Let God's love give you an even bigger desire to bring Him glory!

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God's Personal Symphony

Singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, and making music to the Lord in your hearts. { Ephesians 5:19 }

reating music is my all-time favorite activity. Sometimes I think of people as instruments or voices. On our own, we can bring praise to God through our beautiful, unique sound. However, when we work together, it can create a symphony.

It is so easy to get caught up in what we can do as individuals that we can forget about our fellow Christians. God loves the sound of our personal praise. But He also loves to hear our voices altogether. It is important that in the busy schedule of life, we do not ignore the importance of praising God with other believers.

God made us all to glorify Him—both on our own and together. You can pray, sing, or even dance! Be a part of the symphony that He has created. Make a joyful sound with those who love Him!

ACTION POINT: Are you involved in a group that you can sing or pray with? Maybe it's at church, a Bible club at school, or even a prayer group with your friends. Make it a goal to glorify God with other believers.

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Do Not. Be Afraid

Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen. { 1 Timothy 1:17 }

toured with the True Girl team a couple of years ago. It changed my life! Never before have I seen the gospel at work right in front of my eyes over and over again.

One thing that Dannah taught us before going on the road was that we are all fearfully and wonderfully made. (This comes from Psalm 139:12–14). Not only did God create you and me with a purpose in mind, but also fearfully and wonderfully.

When God says "fearfully made," that means He made us full of honor, awe, and respect. Because God is worthy of respect, we are respectfully made. Because God is full of honor, we are honorably made. When God says "wonderfully made," that means He made us full of beauty, delight, and glory. Because God is beautiful, He beautifully made us. Because God is full of glory, He gloriously made us.

ACTION POINT: You are fearfully and wonderfully made. Do you believe this truth? Take a moment to pray. You can do it alone or with someone you trust. Ask God to help you see and believe it.

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Christ Be Magnified

Make thankfulness your sacrifice to God and keep the vows you made to the Most High. Then call on me when you are in trouble, and I will rescue you, and you will give me glory. { Psalm 50:14–15 }

s I prepared a Sunday school lesson on glorifying God, I wrote the words "God is powerful" as tiny as I could in the middle of a piece of paper. I taped it up in the front of the classroom. The children had a hard time reading what it said from their seats. I brought a magnifying glass with me and called several of them to use it to read the sentence. Once they had the glass, it was easy to see what the paper said.

What was the point of doing this? It was to demonstrate what it means to glorify God. We take a truth about God through how we speak and live, and we magnify or make "bigger" that truth so that others can see it.

When we decide to live a life glorifying God, we can magnify what we learn about God so others will see Him more clearly!

ACTION POINT: Use a magnifying glass and look at things closely. As you do, you will see details that you wouldn't otherwise see. Pray and ask God to help you use your life to bring glory to His name.

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Heart Check

LORD, we show our trust in you by obeying your laws; our heart's desire is to glorify your name. { Isaiah 26:8 }

as there ever been something in your life that you know you *should* do, but you just really don't want to do it? Maybe it's finishing your chores or doing your homework? Sometimes it's hard to want to do the right things.

Take a look at the key verse for today. When I first read this verse, I thought, "Wow, could I say that to God right now and mean it? Is my heart's desire to glorify God's name?" If I'm being honest, there are days when I don't want to glorify God. Instead, I want to do what I want!

It's on days like that when I have to check my heart. I ask God to change me so that I want to glorify Him and obey His Word. I ask Him to help me trust that His way is better than mine.

ACTION POINT: Pray this with me: "Lord, would You help me want to glorify You? Sometimes it's easy to do what I want instead of obeying You. Grow in my heart a desire to praise Your name through how I live. Amen."

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he is worth it

If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and heal their land. { 2 Chronicles 7:14 NIV }

once went camping at Max Patch Mountain in North Carolina with my closest friends. I was so excited to get to the top of that mountain to set up our tent and watch the sunset! About two miles into our hike, I felt like I was going to fall over. I'd packed too much stuff! I needed help, but I didn't want to admit it. I looked to the sky and stopped in my tracks. What would Jesus have me do at this moment? I realized that my selfish thinking was keeping me from enjoying the incredible beauty of His creation.

So, I humbled myself and asked for help. A good friend of mine was happy to carry one of my bags up to the top. When we reached the top, it was so worth it! The pink and orange sunset stretched beautifully across the sky, proclaiming the glory of our Father in heaven.

ACTION POINT: Take some time today to 90 outside and enjoy God's beautiful creation. Notice the details in all that He has made. Our Father is a wonderful artist!
