

This Mom + Daughter date is going to be a little different because it doesn't have to be just you and your daughter. All generations of women in your family are invited to share in this time with you. So grab grandma, your favorite aunties, and some cousins and start telling your stories! We promise you'll have a "glow"-rious time! Here are some steps you can follow:

- Use the cards as prompts. Before you start asking questions from the conversation cards, let everyone know that these cards are simply meant to START the conversation. These prompts are just a fun way to help people tell their stories.
- Give defails. After each person answers a question, have them tell a little story about that topic. For example, the question "What was the name of the church you grew up in?" opens up the door for the responder to talk about what they liked about that church and how it helped them grow in the Lord.
- Read Psalm 145.4. You (and any older generations present) can talk to the younger ones about why it's important to share our testimonies. Ask them questions that will help them get more comfortable with telling others their God stories. And Mom, these questions aren't age-specific so open them up to everyone.

Here are a few to get you started:

- How did your story with God begin?
- Where are you in your story with God now?
- What are some things you hope to learn about God in the future?
- What are some ways you have declared God's power?
- Does sharing your testimony make you nervous? Why?
- Name three people you think you can share your testimony with this week?
- Pray together. Ask God to give each of you courage to share your stories with others. Pray for fruit as you proclaim His power to those around you!
