Hi True Girl Mom!

How do you celebrate the unique differences in your daughter while still directing her to grow into a woman defined by God's Word? This month we'll shout: Hooray for Girls! And we'll offer you a chance to write your daughter a permission slip to express her femininity in her own unique way.

Proverbs 31:30 will light the way. Let's read it:

> Charm is deceptive, and beauty does not last; but a woman who fears the Lord will be greatly praised.



As you listen to this month's True Girl MomCast, you'll learn that the Hebrew word for charm is "chen". It can mean enchanting, fascinating, or spellbinding. Charm enchants with an external personality that does not match the internal reality. Right off the bat, this verse is declaring: be real! Don't deceive. We've got to free our girls to be themselves.

But the verse puts this invitation under submission to the ingredient that makes a woman worthy of praise: *fearing* the Lord! Let's learn what it means and teach it to our girls this month!

- Enjoy some mom+claughter time cloing something she enjoys. Doesn't matter what, just make sure it's a reflection of her personality and interests.
- Have a conversation about being the unique girl God created her to be. You want to help her to understand that to "glorify" God does not mean embracing stereotypes.
 - What kind of girl are you? Ask your daughter to describe herself and what she loves. What does she want to be known for? What interests her?
 - **Read Proverbs 31:30.** This verse talks about "fearing God." It is an essential quality of a godly woman. Do you think it means being scared silly? [Answer: no] What kind of fear might this verse mean? [Respect. Honor. Obedience to God and His Word.] How can you live this out in your life?
- Pray over your daughter. Bless the unique differences God has crafted in her personality and invite her to embrace them as you pray.
